Forrest Memorial Award from the Canadian Church Press for excellence in socially conscious religious journalism, among other writing awards. She is co-author of two books about the Canadian Church: Shifting Stats Shaking the Church: 40 Canadian Churches Respond (2015), Going Missional (2012); and editor of Evangelicals Around the World: a global handbook for the 20th century (Thomas Nelson, 2015), and The Lord's Prayer (Wipf & Stock, 2015), by faculty at the University of Toronto (Wycliffe College). Stiller moderates the Religion and Society series at the University of Toronto, a debate series between leading atheists and theologians. She lives in Ottawa and graduated with a Master of Fine Arts in Creative Non-Fiction from University of King's College, Dalhousie in the spring of 2018.
