Greetings from all of us here at Bishop McAllister College and Anglican Seminary (primary section). We have started the school year well, opening the first week of February. This year we will be around 800 students in all the sections of the school.

We enjoyed very much a visit from Rosemarie and Darryl Kingston, Terry Sleep (St. Lukes Gondola Point) in February. Rosemarie was able to spend time with the sponsored students, and Darryl and Terry wired the new library building. We are very grateful.

We had a good year in 2018, although were saddened to have Canon Caleb Twinamatsiko leave the school after so many years of service. But we have a great new headteacher, Rev. Patience Kyoshabire, who has been a teacher at the school for the past 17 years, most recently serving as a Deputy Headteacher.

Since I last wrote, we have made tremendous progress on the library project. Actually it is quite miraculous. We had no idea what we might accomplish in 2018, as we were faced with the most daunting phase of the project, the suspended slab, costing a third of the entire construction costs. But praise be to God, not only were able to complete that phase, but were also able to construct the walls of the upper floor an even put on the roof. To God be the glory! What we thought might take more than six years, looks like less than three if we continue to make progress at the same rate. We are very excited.

We are so very grateful to the Diocesan ACW, as well as the various branches all across the Diocese of Fredericton. Your support of the student sponsorship program is making a tremendous difference in the lives of so many children, giving them an opportunity for a brighter future. Your most recent contribution on the part of the Diocesan ACW was very timely, and was so helpful in purchasing the electrical materials for library.

I would like to send my special thanks to all of you for supporting me, so generously. Without your support my 21 years at Bishop McAllister College would not have been possible. I can't say thank you enough.

Tuesday Meeting

The theme of this year's annual was "Listening for the Will of God". Registration took place between 9:30am and 10:15am. Upward of 85 women register from all 7 deaneries. Three past Presidents were hi listed Glenna Geer, Lois Baker and Ruth Alexander. After registration a time of fellowship and refreshments occurred in the lower level of the church.

After the welcome, Rosemarie shared a story from the biography of Hannah emphasising women in leadership. Judy Cairns gave information and necessary safe church announcements to the gathering.

Rosemarie then asked for the appointment of the Courtesy Committee. Jill Stewart, Miramichi Chaleur Deanery agreed to lead the committee. The summary will be on the second day after business meeting.

Holy Eucharist, BAS, followed, celebrated by the Right Rev. David Edwards, Bishop of the Diocesan of Fredericton.

Assistance were Ven. Brent Ham, Archdeacon of Moncton, Rev. Kevin Borthwick, Rector of Shediac & Rev. Rose Steeves, Diocesan ACW Chaplin. Lay readers were Judy Cairns, Rosemarie Kingston and Muriel Connors. Prayers roof the People – Rev. Rose Steeves

Bishop Edwards talked about the 2 laws of the Church. John 14; 'I am the way, the truth and life'. First law 'love God's and second 'love your neighbour's '. He challenged us to show the Church through our personal walk with Jesus and others seeing Christ live through us. He asked two questions What is it to be a follower of the way? And two How do we show others this? Bishop Edwards discussed BELLS.

B for blessings, with something as simple as a smile for each, possibly sharing a coffee at Tim Horton's. L for listen to God, what so ever you hear in my name, I will do it says the Lord, that the Father maybe glorified in the Son. L for learn, more of our life of faith and about Jesus. S for send, a willingness to go out with the Gospel in word and action. 'Followers of the way' was the original name of Christians.

Following Eucharist, Diane Todd led the members in 'The Prayer Service for the Deceased ACW member's. She read 59 names for 2017.

Roll Call continued with upward of 85 participated for the two days.

Guest Speakers

After a beautiful lunch, with time to visit and renew old friendships, the members reconvened at the church to listen to the two guest speakers.

Shawn Branch, Diocesan Team, Parish Development Officer explained his role and lead the members in a discussion on how he can support leadership among the Parish, Ministers, and the Bishop. He asked us a question 'What does the church mean to us? 'Many thoughts were given among the ACW ladies. Following are some thoughts:

The Church means- family, fellowship, support, peace, love, and serenity that passes all understanding.

Shawn talked about how the church is facing resistance in this age. He like the Bishop, encouraged us to leave the

building and go out into the community and show our faith. Remember BELLS. He shared that more than 1,300 books were ordered by Parishes to study. (Surprise The World by Michael Frost) Other communication tools are the N.B. Anglican and Launching Out Newsletter, It's time to show them to 'no faith' people. Help find the specific needs of your community and respond in the here and now. He took questions and heard about how the ACW members are trying to meet the needs of their communities. Following are examples:

- Faith Family Festival- sharing of meals, games and music.
- Dinner and a movie
- Weekly parent tot gathering
- Supporting new mothers home from hospital
- Book clubs
- Monday morning outreach
- Friends at Tim Horton
- Quilting for the community
- Gospel and Blues Grass Music
- Cafes
- Pastoral Nursing
- World Day of Prayer

Our second guest speaker was Rev. Canon Paul Jeffries from Bishop McAllister College in Uganda. He spoke about life at the College, a subject near and dear to our hearts.

Twenty three years ago he started in Kenya, thanks to Audrey Dawe, one of our past Presidents, he moved to the College. He has been there for the last 20 years.

The college now has close to 1000 students. IN 1999 there were 125 students. 30 students were sponsored by the ACW branches. NOW the Diocese of Fredericton sponsors 140 students.

Paul described the College and its overall look. The girls 'Safe Haven Dormitory, the boys 'Eagles Nest Dormitory' St. Andrew's Chapel 2016 added. The building of the Kitchen and Eating hall with 8 new dormitories came next. Now, building of the new library is taking place. \$200,00.00 is needed to finish the library. Paul spoke about all the support and the appreciation from the College. He thanked everyone for the sponsorships, building investments and prayers.

Paul gave samples of how the day for the students start at 5am reading and study, then to breakfast followed by Chapel then School. The students have carried on the rich art of storytelling. We hear about the Project Boys, sports, grade levels, trades and return of students to teach at the College.

Inez Esterbrooks thanked Paul for his dedication to the College and letting us be part of his projects at Bishop McAllister College.

Rosemarie continued with the meeting and read more from the Biography of Hannah Comb.

Showing how women in leadership roles do God's will and work often within the frame work of BELLS.

Diocesan ACW

ACW Funds - An Explanation – Revised

Divinity Scholarship

Branches are asked to try to contribute something to this Fund. All money received is sent once a year to Diocesan Synod to be invested, and the interest is used to assist theological students from this Diocese. Over the years, the grants given to these students have been of great help to them.

Administration

Every Branch is asked to contribute \$50 yearly. The money is used for costs pertaining to our Annual Meeting (e.g. printing of the Diocesan ACW Annual Reports), stationery, stamps, bank charges, and additional items as voted on at the Diocesan Annual or Executive Meeting (e.g. extra expenses from Diocesan ACW events like the Diocesan ACW Annual Meeting, Quiet Day, etc.). Travelling costs for our ACW President attending the National Presidents' Conference, Farraline Place Board meetings, Annual Deanery meetings, and planning meetings for the Diocesan Annual meeting (not Executive meetings) are also paid from this Fund.

Social Action

Every Branch is asked to contribute \$25 yearly. Grants from this Fund are used to support students at Bishop McAllister College, PWRDF, Coverdale Foundation, or any similar cause which the Diocesan Executive feels our members would like to support. Recipients are approved at the Diocesan ACW Annual Meeting.

Extra-Cent-A-Day

This Fund is used to assist parishes in need, facing large rectory renovations. Over the years, the many grants given have been a great financial boost to these parishes, and there are many families living in rectories that, as a result, benefit from living in upgraded homes. Originally, this Fund was set up to help install bathrooms in rectories; but, fortunately, this need was outgrown, and it was decided to continue the Fund for other major repairs in rectories. Parishes must apply to the Bishop for grants, and the Bishop has to approve each application before assistance is given. Some Branches use birthday money; others take up a collection at each meeting, while other Branches just give a donation. It is up to each Branch to decide what they will give, or even whether they will give to this Fund. Traditionally, it has been calculated as \$3.65, but now is rounded to \$4.00/member/year.

Our Fair Share

Branches contribute to this Fund as they feel called and are able to. All money is voted on at the ACW Diocesan Annual Meeting, and it is one way for us to join together and support, in Christ's name, many causes which individual Branches could not themselves support. Transition Homes, Missionaries, Canon Paul Jeffries' stipend, Threshold Ministries (formerly Church Army), Council of the North, Inner City Youth Ministries, Teens Encounter Christ, Diocesan School of Church Music are some of the places where we have been able to assist. The many letters of thanks we receive tell how much our assistance is appreciated.

Any money sent to the Treasurer for things other than the funds listed above is forwarded to

wherever it has been designated for, but it is preferable if Branches would send it directly themselves. Some Branches still use the United Thank Offering Boxes, which is fine, and this money is put into Our Fair Share. Family Life Donations are put into Social Action. Please make all cheques payable to the Diocesan ACW, and include a return address so that a receipt can be mailed.

Helen Burton Fund

All money is invested, and the interest is given once a year to the J.J. Fraser Farraline Place. This project has been of great interest to our members over the years, especially since we took on the care of Farraline Place in 1988.

William and Mary Quinn Trust Fund

A number of years ago, the Diocesan ACW was left a large sum of money to be invested, and the interest only to be used. Each year at our Diocesan ACW Annual Meeting, a prepared disbursement of this interest is voted on. Individual Branches do not contribute to this Fund. Threshold Ministries (formerly Church Army), Camp Medley, Camp Brookwood, Farraline Place are just a few of the places where this interest has been sent over the years.

Fanny Billings Estate

This fund was also a bequest to the Diocesan ACW, and the interest is spent at the discretion of the ACW Diocesan Executive.

From Deacon Rose Steeves, ACW Chaplain
