Fruit of the Spirit Devotional

Weekly devotional based on each of the Fruit of the Spirit







week 2: Joy

PREPARE - Let's talk about JOY. Put away distractions and pray, "God show us something new today."

LEARN - I have told you these things so that you will be filled with my joy. Yes, your joy will overflow! John 15:11 NLT

Do you know the difference between happiness and joy? Happiness is often based on our circumstances. It's a feeling we get when something good happens. It's fun to be happy, but God wants us to have something more - true joy that lives



deep within our hearts and stays there no matter what. Joy comes from Jesus and remains no matter what is going on around us. This doesn't mean we won't feel sad or disappointed at times. But when we have true joy, our sadness will eventually go away and be replaced by the joy of Jesus. The Bible says Jesus fills us with overflowing joy so we can share it with others.

ASK -

- 1, What is the difference between happiness and joy?
- 2. What brings you true joy?
- 3. What are some ways we can share our joy with others?

NAME the Truth - True joy comes from my relationship with Jesus.

TAKE Action - Do something together that brings you joy. Plan a family outing or a party. Invite friends to join so you can share your joy with others!

DIG DEEPER

Some days we just don't feel joy. Maybe we are tired or we've had a tough day at school. It's easy to get in a bad mood when things don't seem to be going our way. But God promises us his joy will be our strength when we need it (Nehemiah 8:10). It's ok to feel sad or mad or frustrated but it's important to take those feelings to Jesus and exchange them for his joy. It's no fun to stay in a bad mood. But it's so much fun to have joy! Pray and ask Jesus to help you when you get stuck in a rut. Trust that he will take care of you and ask him to fill you with joy as you leave your worries with him.





WEEK 3: PEACE

PREPARE - Let's talk about PEACE. Put away distractions and pray, "God show us something new today."

LEARN - You will keep in perfect peace all who trust in you, all whose thoughts are fixed on you. Isaiah 26:3 NLT

Peace can be hard to understand because it's not something we can see clearly with our eyes. Sometimes peace is visible on the outside. Outward peace looks



ASK -

- What does real peace feel like?
- 2. Why is peace sometimes hard to understand?
- 3. What are some ways we can be a peacemaker?

NAME the Truth - Peace comes when I trust Jesus.

TAKE Action - Peace often comes through prayer. Spend time praying together for peace. Share something that has brought you worry. Then let Jesus replace your fear with his peace as you trust in him.

DIG DEEPER

Conflict is a fight or disagreement between two opposing forces. You may experience conflict at school or with your friends. Sometimes people have different ideas and find it hard to get along. But you can be a peacemaker in those situations. Jesus can help you understand how to bring peace when those around you are fighting. Being a peacemaker doesn't mean you stop standing up for what you believe in. It means you bring a calm presence to tough situations. With God's help, you will know what to do and say to promote peace. Matthew 5:9 (in The Message) says that when we are peacemakers, we will discover who we really are. Because without fear, conflict and worry, we are better able to be who God made us to be.



WEEK 4: PATIENCE

PREPARE - Let's talk about PATIENCE. Put away distractions and pray, "God show us something new today."

LEARN - Let's not get tired of doing what is good. At just the right time we will reap a harvest of blessing if we don't give up. Galatians 6:9 NLT



Patience means waiting without complaining. It can be hard to wait for things like big events - our birthday, Christmas or a family vacation. It's tough to wait for our turn on a ride or with a toy or electronic device. It's one thing to wait but to do it without whining or grumbling is what this fruit of the spirit is all about. The Bible talks a lot about patience and is filled with many stories of how God blessed those who waited with patience while trusting him. Patience is tricky but with God's help, we can wait with a good attitude.

ASK -

- 1. What does it mean to be patient?
- 2. Why is it important to wait with a good attitude?
- 3. How can God help us as we wait?

NAME the Truth - I can be patient with God's help.

TAKE Action - Make a list or draw a picture of things you are waiting for. An upcoming family trip or an electronic device you've been wanting for a long time? Pray over this list and give it over to God, trusting that he will bring all of these things in his perfect timing.

DIG DEEPER

Sometimes it's important to have patience when trying something new. Have you ever tried a new sport or an instrument and when it didn't come easily, you were tempted to give up? Just like we need to have patience in waiting for things to come, we also need to have patience when trying new things. This is sometimes called endurance. In order to get truly good at something. . .drawing, singing, dancing, football, basketball (you get the idea), we must practice with patience, enduring time and keeping a commitment to develop our ability. The next time you are tempted to give up on something, pray and ask God to help you find the patience to keep going!





WEEK 5: KINDNESS

PREPARE - Let's talk about KINDNESS. Put away distractions and pray, "God show us something new today."

LEARN - Be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave you. Ephesians 4:32 ESV



Kindness is more than just a behavior, it's an attitude. When we feel and show concern for others, we spread kindness. Many times, this means we put someone else's need above our own. We can do this by saying something nice, including someone who is being left out, or helping someone who is in need. God showed us kindness by sending his son to love us and die for us. He continues to show us kindness daily as he takes care of us. It is because of God's loving kindness that we can be kind to others.

ASK -

- 1. What does it mean to be kind?
- 2. What are some ways we can spread kindness?
- 3. Why is God our best example of kindness?

NAME the Truth - When I am kind to others I share God's love.

TAKE Action - Make a list of random acts of kindness. Maybe your family can surprise a stranger by paying for their lunch. Or you can let a friend go first on the playground. Talk about your list and get excited about surprising someone with kindness this week!

DIG DEEPER

One of the greatest ways we can show kindness is by including others. It's very normal for kids to form groups at school, connecting with certain people who have similar personalities or interests. But sometimes there are kids who don't make friends easily and they can feel left out and very alone. God wants us to notice those children and reach out to them in kindness. It may not be the popular thing to do to invite the quiet kid or the new girl to play, but it's the kind thing to do. And by doing so, you are showing that person the same kindness God shows you. There is great joy in loving with kindness. Open your eyes to notice those in need around you and you'll be amazed at how you feel when you show them God's love.

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WEEK 6: GOODNESS

PREPARE - Let's talk about GOODNESS. Put away distractions and pray, "God show us something new today."

LEARN - A good person produces good things from the treasury of a good heart. Matthew 12:35 NLT

You are probably praised regularly for being good or doing a good job. That's because goodness often comes out in our attitude and actions. Because God is good, when we grow in our relationship with him, goodness gets planted deep within our hearts and we continue to make good choices. Goodness is about being kind, being honest and having a good attitude or behavior. Just like the other fruit we've been studying, goodness grows when we stay connected to Jesus. Goodness is a sweet treasure we store in our hearts so that it's ready to be shared with those who need it.

ASK -

- 1. What is goodness?
- 2. What are some examples of God's goodness?
- 3. What are some ways we can share goodness with others?

NAME the Truth - When I treasure goodness, it's stored in my heart and ready to be shared.

TAKE Action - Grab an old cardboard box and decorate your own treasure box. On small strips of paper, write down ways that God has been good to you and your family and ways you can be good to others. Put them in the box. Keep your goodness treasure box in a place you can see it. Pull out those strips of paper from time to time as a reminder of God's goodness and how you can share goodness with others.

DIG DEEPER

Goodness is a character trait that comes from knowing a good God. As we grow in relationship with him, we become like him, just like we often become like the friends we hang out with. If you spend time with people who have a bad attitude or don't behave well, you may take on some of their bad habits. This is why it's so important to hang out with friends who share a desire to do good. Goodness does not mean that you will always be perfect. We all make mistakes. But when we have treasures of goodness stored up in our heart, we will, more often than not, choose what is right. By surrounding ourselves with God and others who follow him, we are "clinging to what is good" (Romans 12:9).

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WEEK 7: FAITHFULNESS

PREPARE - Let's talk about FAITHFULNESS. Put away distractions and pray, "God show us something new today."

LEARN - Let love and faithfulness never leave you; bind them around your neck, write them on the tablet of your heart. Then you will win favor and a good name in the sight of God and man. Proverbs 3:3-4 NIV



How do you want others to remember you? Do you want to be known as flakey and irresponsible or faithful and trustworthy? Faithful means – steady, reliable, loyal, trusted. A faithful person is consistent, he or she doesn't change. Do you know anyone who fits this description? The Bible tells us many times that God is faithful and he can be trusted. When we follow God and his faithful son, Jesus, we learn how to be loyal and trustworthy, too. As we develop faithfulness and carry it with us wherever we go, we will be looked up to and honored by God and other people.

ASK -

- 1. Why is God so trustworthy?
- 2. What are some examples of God's faithfulness?
- 3. What are some ways we can be faithful to others?

NAME the Truth - I can be faithful because God is faithful.

TAKE Action - Make a list of 3 responsibilities you can take on this week. Maybe helping around the house with a chore or helping a friend. Commit to be faithful in completing the tasks on your list.

DIG DEEPER

Proverbs 3:3-4 says, when we carry love and faithfulness with us always, we will win favor (attention, trust) with God and other people. You probably love being liked at school and in your neighborhood. It feels good when others pay attention to you and want to be around you. When we are faithful and trustworthy, others will notice. Those strong character traits will draw people to us. Love and faithfulness are the right reasons to be liked. More than how you dress or how good you are at something, these traits hold value. When you focus on being a person who loves and is faithful to others, you will find your place in every season of life. And just as Jesus promises that those who are faithful with little things will be given bigger things (Luke 16:10), you'll see your influence and blessings grow as you continue to remain faithful.

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WEEK 8: GENTLENESS

PREPARE - Let's talk about GENTLENESS. Put away distractions and pray, "God show us something new today."

LEARN - Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love. Ephesians 4:2 NIV

We often tell you to be gentle with something. Your brother or sister. . .mommy's phone. . .when we are walking through a store with breakable things. Being careful



or touching people and things respectfully are ways we can be gentle on the outside. But God also wants us to be gentle on the inside, with peace in our heart and a pleasant attitude. Our verse this week tells us we should be like Jesus, with a gentle spirit. A gentle spirit doesn't mean that we are weak but that we understand the value of peace and want to spread it around. This is Jesus' gentle way of loving and it can be our way as well.

ASK -

- 1. Who is our greatest example of gentleness?
- 2. What does it look like to be gentle?
- 3. What are some ways we can have a gentle spirit?

NAME the Truth - Jesus' gentle love teaches me to be gentle with my attitude and actions.

TAKE Action - Practice being gentle by helping with tasks that require gentleness - with a smaller sibling or washing the dishes. Look for a new chore or responsibility that will allow you to practice gentleness. You can also practice gentleness in your speech. The next time you want to yell or use harsh words, try a gentle tone instead.

DIG DEEPER

Matthew 5:5 says, "Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the earth." The word "meek" means kind, considerate and gentle with others. A meek person may seem weak but in reality they are far from it. The world often tells us that strong people are tough and do whatever needs to be done to get what they want. But this is not God's way. God promises us that when we take on his attitude of gentleness and love, we will "inherit the earth." This means we get to be a part of God's kingdom. Being a part of God's kingdom means we are a member of his family. As God's family member, we can be an example of his ways. We can show the world that gentle strength always chooses love.



WEEK 9: SELF-CONTROL

PREPARE - Let's talk about SELF-CONTROL. Put away distractions and pray, "God show us something new today."

LEARN - For God gave us a spirit not of fear but of power and love and self-control. 2 Timothy 1:7 ESV



Self-control means being able to control our actions or responses. Sometimes when we are upset, frustrated or mad, we react with angry words or actions. Sometimes our actions are reactions to what is going on around us. But God can help us choose a different way. 2 Timothy 1:7 tells us that God has given us a spirit of power, love and self-control. This means when we are walking with God and looking to him for guidance, we have the tools to help us choose a better reaction. Instead of hitting someone back or grabbing a toy they took from us, we can choose to practice self-control and respond peacefully. Self-control might look like taking a deep breath and walking away. It might mean we go find an adult to help us. Self-control can also mean choosing to say and do nothing at all.

ASK -

- 1. What is self-control?
- 2. What tools has God provided to help us practice self-control?
- 3. What are some areas you need to grow in self-control?

NAME the Truth - I can choose the better reaction by practicing self-control.

TAKE Action - The next time you get mad or frustrated, stop and count to 10 before reacting. Practice taking a moment to give yourself time to choose the best reaction.

DIG DEEPER

When we get older, our self-control becomes about more than just us. Especially at school or with friends, you will come up against situations where you need to exercise self-control for your own good and for the good of those around you. Practicing self-control can be for something as small as paying attention and not talking in class or as big as choosing not to cheat on a test or participate when others are teasing a classmate. Self-control means that YOU are choosing your actions. That you are not being pressured by those around you to participate in something you know is wrong. Remember, God has given us the tools – a spirit of power and love – to make the right choice in every situation.

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Serve Your Neighbour

During COVID-19 and the lockdown, we may not be able to see or interact with many people, however that should not stop us from serving one another. Be creative and reach out people in your church, family, friends, community.

Write a person's name (can be family, friends, church community, members of the community, nursing home residences etc) on a piece of paper and place them in a bag or container. Then as a family or individually draw a name out of the bag. Over the summer, look for a way to do something kind for the person you picked. (Please be aware of COVID-19 restrictions)





God's Plan Activity

The following activity is designed to help children understand God's overall plan for His people and where all the Bible stories fit into that plan. They can see where the "Fruits of God's Spirit" come into our lives. Be creative and use materials found around the house, keep the story and tell again or share with friends and relatives as a way of spreading the "Good News."

- 3 trees: Lego, plasticine, other
- Animal to represent creation
- People figures Adam, Eve, Noah, Moses, Abraham, Prophet, King, Judge (Could be Lego or plasticine)
- Manger with Jesus:
- A Cross
- Jesus, disciples (us) (Could be Lego or plasticine)



Script:

ANIMAL (or something to represent creation -Several thousand years ago) "In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth. He made the sun, moon, stars, the water, the sky, the world – and all the birds, trees, rocks and flowers. The last thing he created was people in His own image." (Genesis)

ADAM and EVE: "God made man and woman and named them Adam and Eve. He gave them a garden to live in and God was there too and the talked with them."

TWO TREES: It was God's garden and he put two trees in the middle of the garden. He told them not to eat from a certain tree that he knew would be bad for them. But they did not listen and disobeyed. They wanted to have the fruit and to know everything that God did. They had to leave the garden before they ate from the other tree, the **Tree of Life** and live forever separated from God. Now they would die. Outside the garden they had to work hard for their food and had many troubles.

But God had a plan. Adam and Eve had children, and their children had children, and their children had children and on and on. People did cruel things and turned away from God. But God still loved His creation.

NOAH, ABRAHAM, MOSES, PROPHET, JUDGE, KING: God found people in every generation that wanted to talk with him, such as Noah, Abraham, Moses, Prophets like Isaiah, Judges like Deborah and Kings like David. They would be part of God's plan to bring people back into relationship to Him.

God promised to send a savior to restore the close relationship between God and His people. **INFANT JESUS and MANAGER**. (About 2 thousand years ago) God loved us so much that when the time was right, He sent His Son, Jesus, into the world to be our Savior. He was born into the world through a woman named Mary. (Christmas)

ADULT JESUS: Jesus grew up and lived a perfect life. He never sinned. He taught people about God. He performed many miracles showing His great power. He healed many people. He made the blind see. He made the deaf hear. He made the lame walk. Jesus even raised the dead. He told us to love one another.

CROSS: Some leaders did not like what Jesus was doing and saying. They wanted Him killed. Since Jesus never sinned, He did not have to die but He chose to die to take the blame for all the wrong we do. Jesus died on the cross butt did not stay dead He rose again on Easter day and 40 days later He went to be with God. He did not leave us alone. God sent His Holy Spirit to be with us and help us.

2 DICIPLES: We are His disciples and Jesus send us out to tell others the Good News. "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life. John 3:16 (NRSV)

Jesus said He would come back.

TREE : The Bible teaches that blessed are people who believe in Jesus and do His commandments for they will NOW have the right to the **Tree of Life** and may enter through the gates into the Heavenly City to LIVE FOREVER with God. (Revelations)
