## **Sowing and Reaping**



In the nine years since we launched Pennies and Sparrows, we've learned a number of important lessons, one of which is this: When we step out in faith, trying something innovative and fresh, a fruitful new ministry is sometimes the result. However, if we insist on playing it safe—burying our talents, as it were then we are guaranteed no return. Take, for example, the English Language Day Camp which we first launched last summer—a program which gave newcomer youth an opportunity to make friends, explore the city and, of course, improve their English. I'll be honest with you: at first, I wondered if such a ministry was even worth trying. Would we get enough volunteers to run the program? Would newcomer parents actually be interested in signing their kids up for such a camp? In the end, our decision to go ahead with the day camp turned out to be a wise one, with 20 kids enrolled and an outstanding team of volunteers to teach and mentor them. In fact, the ministry worked out so well that we decided to run two separate English Language Day Camps this summer—one for children and another for junior teens. Both Day Camps were organized and implemented by the latest

member of the Pennies and Sparrows Team— Clare Andrews. With her at the helm of this ministry, we were able to serve nearly twice as many newcomer kids— kids who have come to our little city from every continent of the world.

As the Apostle Paul once wrote to the Church in Corinth: "The person who sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and the person who sows generously will also reap generously" (2 Corinthians 9:6). We believe that, this year, we've been able to sow generously - to invest our time, energy and finances into ministries that have born fruit. However, we would not have been able to invest in our community in such a way unless you— the many supporters of Pennies and Sparrows— were first willing to invest in us. Many of you have devoted hours of your precious time to volunteer for ministries such as the English Language Day Camp. Others have generously donated money. Some of you have simply made it a point to pray for us regularly. Please know that we deeply appreciate your support. Without you, Pennies and Sparrows simply wouldn't bear fruit at all.



#### **Kids Lead**

**Program** this summer— a program that gave children and youth an opportunity to learn about the problems of this hurting community (poverty, homelessness, food insecurity, crime, etc.) and meet people from organizations who have been working hard

to address these challenges. This year, a total of 20 youth were able to participate in this program and, as far as we could tell, they had a wonderful time. Special thanks go to our team of volunteers, without whom this ministry wouldn't be possible.

## **New Emmaus Way Team**

Because of you, we managed to launch another Emmaus Way team of support—this time around a single mother, struggling to parent a toddler with serious medical issues and another child on the way. This team is made up of roughly six women of various ages, all of whom have stepped up to offer drives to medical appointments, babysitting, parenting advice and, most importantly of all, friendship. Because of this team, this single mother can rest assured that, when her baby is finally born, she won't be alone. Instead, she'll be surrounded with a community of support that is focussed on making life easier both for her and her children.

## **Adult English Classes**

Because of you, we were able to relaunch our adult English Language classes this fall. This year, Terence has stepped back from his role as teacher and handed the ministry over to the two other members of the Pennies and Sparrows team— Miriam Westin (who teaches beginner English each Monday) and Clare Andrews (who teaches intermediate English each Wednesday). Not only do their students get a chance to practice conversation skills, built their vocabulary and improve their grammar; they also get a chance to get out of the home and socialize. This is very important, considering the fact that newcomers— lacking the social connections that others might take for granted— are particularly vulnerable to loneliness and isolation.
