Katharine is a Canadian Christian climate scientist who considers the climate change problem from the perspective of hope rather than fear and suggests lots of little things we can each do.

PARISH ACTION: Educate

your congregation – have a parish screening of a documentary on climate change, conduct a sermon or study series on the 5<sup>th</sup> Mark of Mission (*Strive to safeguard the integrity of creation, and sustain and renew the life of the earth*), or the 2022 Lambeth Call on Environment and Sustainable Development.
