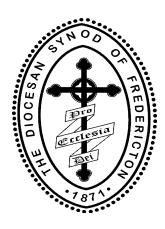

COMMUNICATION OFFICER

The communications officer works to ensure effective, interactive and timely communications intended to support the efforts of the Anglican Diocese of Fredericton.

Communications Strategy: I have been with the Anglican Diocese of Fredericton as its communications officer for four years. My role continues to grow as the need grows. This past year a significant amount of my time has been spent developing a communications strategy with help from the Communications team. This has included having a new logo designed for us, and coming up with a new tagline for the diocese: *Followers of Jesus sharing hope and help in our communities and beyond.*

New Brunswick Anglican: The New Brunswick Anglican now regularly runs to 20 pages, and sometimes 24 pages, which I believe is the largest Anglican paper in Canada, surpassing even the Anglican Journal. The Anglican Journal often reprints stories from our weekly eNews, giving them a national audience.

Nutter Funeral: The NB Anglican went to press the day of Archbishop Nutter's funeral in September. Nevertheless, I was able, in those few days between his death and his funeral, to rework the paper to include a story, biography and photos from his funeral. The following month had more follow-up, with a story on his funeral. It was a learning experience for me and a hectic week, but I was very satisfied with the coverage.

Anglican Newspapers: This year I attended the annual Anglican Editors Association conference in Halifax. I am the secretary of that group. There we learned of the many coming changes to our papers. A working group of CoGS has been studying the future of the newspapers and its survey results have helped forge a path forward. Their tentative plan is to phase out the printed form of the newspapers, probably within three to five years.

Synod Videos: This year and last, I helped develop and produce the synod videos you may have seen. Video projects are new to me and I am grateful for the support of colleagues Ben Bourque and Shawn Branch.

Speaking Engagements: This year I have been a guest speaker at a few events and parishes, speaking mainly on communications, the voice of women, and how to navigate social media.

Canadian Church Press Awards: Because the Anglican Editors Association joined the Canadian Church Press Association, I was able to participate in the Canadian Church Press annual awards for the first time. In the 2017 awards gala, I won four awards: 1st place - news story; 1st place - feature layout and design; 2nd place - feature photo; honourable mention - interview (2-minute interview).

At the 2018 awards gala, I won six awards: 1st place - news story; 1st place - in-depth treatment of a news event; 2nd place - photo essay; 2nd place - general excellence newspaper; 3rd place - feature layout and design; 3rd place - news photo.

Fredericton Shootings: Just after dawn on Aug. 10 of this year, four people were murdered on the north side of the city, two of whom were members of the Fredericton Police Force. Although he hadn't planned to be in the city and was still on vacation, Bishop David Edwards felt the need to be in Fredericton.

Shortly after he arrived, we crafted a press release noting the terrible events of the day, and advising that everyone who felt the need for support or prayer was welcome to join us for a prayer vigil that evening.

Soon after I sent that release out, the phone began ringing, and in fact, it rang all afternoon with requests for interviews — from national and regional media outlets.

The bishop offered words of encouragement, support and sympathy on CBC News (national), CTV news (national) and CBC radio (New Brunswick). That evening, about 200 people, including two dozen members of the media (national, regional and local) showed up at the vigil, and CBC streamed it live on its website.

There was a vast amount of coverage of the vigil that night and into the next day. Three more media outlets followed up with the bishop afterwards that evening and the next day seeking his opinion on the vigil and the state of the community.

It was a terrible day for all involved, but we were blessed to have been able to provide mourners with a space and time to grieve, and to trumpet the name of Jesus throughout it all.

PARISH DEVELOPMENT OFFICER

Mandate

The Parish Development Officer, working under the direction of the Bishop, fulfils a key role as part of the Synod Office Team through supporting parishioners, congregations, parishes and the diocese to live the 5 Marks of Mission of The Anglican Communion:

- 1. To proclaim the news of the Kingdom;
- 2. To teach, baptize and nurture new believers;
- 3. To respond to human needs by loving service;
- 4. To seek to transform unjust structures of society, to challenge violence of every kind and pursue peace and reconciliation;
- 5. To strive to safeguard creation and to sustain and renew the life of the earth.

The Parish Development Officer will also support and empower the leadership, both lay and ordained, in the diocese to affect the priorities outlined in the Bishop's Charge to Diocesan Synod.

In Review

I joined the Synod Office Team as of January 1, 2018 and since that time have worked to support the Bishop vision for the future of the diocese. At the 2017 Synod, a clear direction of moving into living as missional people was given. The introduction of Michael Frost's Surprise the World (BELLS) was the primary focus. Assembling resources for parishes to use within their own contexts and through whatever means would generate the best response.

I have visited every deanery meeting and several archdeaconry greater chapter meetings – meeting with clergy and lay leadership. From these meetings, parish discernment days have been held as well as other opportunities to have parishes and individuals reach out into their neighbourhoods.

I have been able to support and provide resources to our leadership who are discerning new opportunities for mission and ministry. Through this, I have begun meeting with individuals currently involved in outreach and offering support to them.

At present, I am a member of Bishop's Counsel, the Spiritual Development Team and the Mission & Outreach Teams. During the Diocesan Council meetings, I provide a teaching moment – currently focused on Missional Leadership with the view of helping to shape how we make decisions for the diocese with a Kingdom Perspective.

Looking a head, work has begun on a diocesan ministry conference to be held in June 2019, which will be a conference for the whole diocesan family.

I look forward to continuing to work with our leaders in the parishes to help them see opportunities for reaching out in their communities as well as helping to strengthen our witness of the Good News of Jesus throughout our province.

PERSONNEL AND SAFE CHURCH OFFICER

Mandated Responsibilities:

The Personnel and Safe Church Officer is appointed by Diocesan Council and the Officer's primary responsibilities are:

- Personnel Management (including compensation, training and support, and procedure development)
- Oversight of the Safe Church Program
- Compensation and Benefits Administration
- Policy Development and Administration

Safe Church Training

Taking on this new role, the decision was made to make widely-available training a priority. The first step was to ensure that online training matched the current group training content. Much feedback was received on the differences between the two. Once this was complete, I began work on a video that could be used by parishes to complete training on their own time, not having to rely on myself or another "trainer" to provide the group training. It was a large undertaking, but I believe it has paid off immensely. The video consists of a relatively summarized version of the regulation (reading is still required to have a full understanding), but allows for large-scale coverage without a great sacrifice in time or travel. Both of which would not have been possible due to the staff transitions in 2017-18.

As it stands now, close to 1,000 Safe Church Certificates have been issued. We can thank the Ecclesiastical Insurance questionnaire (more on that later) for many of those, but training is still ongoing with requests for certificates trickling in all the time.

Some work is still required on the online training component (automated confirmation of training completed, quiz score feedback) and the video will be updated to include images of our website following the overhaul, but I'm pleased with the progress made in this area and will continue to monitor feedback for any further changes required.

Transitions and New Hires

To say that 2018 has been an eventful year may be an understatement. I transitioned into my current position from my former position of Financial and Administrative Assistant over the summer of 2017. I unofficially held both positions until September when we hired a new Financial and Administrative Assistant. As Irene Adams was transitioning into (an already severely delayed) retirement, our replacement Treasurer resigned. This left us all with extra duties and the requirement that we work together to ensure nothing "fell through the cracks" while we began another search for a new Diocesan Treasurer. March – May of 2018 were a blur, but we hired Heather Harris-Jones as Diocesan Treasurer and she has been a great fit, both for the position and for the office itself.

We now have an interim Finance and Administrative Assistant to cover a maternity leave, but we settled into a comfortable pace, while finally making progress on process improvements.

Safe Church Insurance Questionnaire and Feedback

This year, Ecclesiastical Insurance (through Marsh Canada Ltd.) rolled out a questionnaire related to Safe Church and the role that it plays in our liability insurance. Parishes were asked to complete the questionnaire to give an idea of where they are in Safe Church implementation. This was a challenging rollout as it is a delicate balance the requirement for insurance purposes and our genuine desire for the safety of all.

The responses and questions were numerous, but we all worked through the questionnaire together. The results now sit with Ecclesiastical Insurance and only a few questionnaires are left outstanding. The questions raised during this process were extremely beneficial in understanding the issues and conflicts that arose as a result of this regulation.

It has given me some direction as to what to work on next, which seems possible now that we are not understaffed. I will be bringing some potential (minor) policy revisions to the HR Committee to discuss, along with the creation of simple templates that can be used for job descriptions, procedures, flow-charts, etc...

I don't take feedback lightly and my desire is to continually improve the process to ensure implementation of Safe Church is a natural progression for the Diocese.

Policy Development

As I previously mentioned, now that we are no longer understaffed, my focus is on developing policies and outlining/clarifying our current procedures. As the synod office methods and procedures have changed over the years, our written policies and regulations have remained much the same. My goal is to ensure we all have a clear understanding of our policies, especially as they related to human resources (i.e. payroll and benefits).

We have made significant progress in the past few months in paring down previous methods (and we can thank Irene Adams for getting us to the point where we can do that!), and now clear documentation is key.

As this is a new position within the Diocese, there has been a level of sorting out what belongs on my desk, on top of the general learning curve. However, through the much-appreciated feedback, encouragement and support, I could not be happier with this transition and I look forward to another period of learning and development within the position of Personnel and Safe Church Officer.

STEWARDSHIP OFFICER

Mandate

Promote all aspects of Stewardship, including Planned Giving, to Parishes and Clergy. Serve on Stewardship Team and promote Stewardship and Back to Church Sundays. Liaise with Finance Committee to speak to Parishes with large projects. Develop network with other Dioceses.

Promote All Aspects of Stewardship

I have met with most clergy and with a monthly column in the NB Anglican promote Stewardship. At the Synod Open House I had Stewardship material available and a power point running on Stewardship. I have made presentations to a number of Parishes and have more planned for the fall. A workshop on Wills is planned for the Archdeaconry of Moncton in the Fall and will then be promoted to the other Archdeacons to take place in the late Fall, Winter and Spring. I am a member of the Canadian Association of Gift Planners and have attended a 1 day workshop on Basics of Gift Planning that they offered.

Serve on Stewardship Team

I have attended most team meetings either in person or by teleconference and assisted with the 2016 and 2017 Stewardship Day and am working with Spiritual Development and Parish Development for a conference in 2019. For 2016 and 2017 material was on the Diocesan website for both Back to Church and Stewardship Sunday, these included a bulletin cover and some suggestions for readings and sermons.

Network with other Dioceses and Officers

In September of 2017 I attended a Stewardship Conference put on by the National Office for all Dioceses Ontario Eastward. I met a number of my counterparts and have email contact information. The conference was very informative and as a result of the people I met my Stewardship column began being published in the Diocesan Times (NS and PEI equivalent of NB Anglican). There were a number of excellent presentations and time for fellowship and I look forward to attending the next one. I have been asked to be a presenter at the Vital Church Maritimes in Truro which will take place the week after Synod.

I look forward to meeting with as many Parishes as possible over the next year.

Meetings:

- Diocesan Council Meetings

- Diocesan Council Team and/or Committee Meetings
 Every Diocesan Council member is expected to be on at least one Council Team and/or Committee
 and to attend Team meetings, providing leadership and being the link to and from Council.
- Greater Chapter meetings
 Every Diocesan Council member belongs to the Greater Chapter and is expected to actively support
 the Archdeacon in preparing for the meetings and providing leadership as appropriate. The Greater
 Chapter is to meet three or four times a year enabling the continuation of the work of Synod and the
 Diocesan Council throughout the Parishes. Provide information to and gather information from
 parish clergy and lay leaders.

Preparation and Follow-up:

• Every Diocesan Council Member is expected to prepare for meetings and their responsibilities, taking time to prayerfully review and reflect on issues and proposals as well as ensure all follow-up is completed.

Participation:

- Every Diocesan Council Member is required to act in the best interests of the Diocesan Synod, in an impartial and nonpartisan manner, being personally accountable for decisions and Council's decisions, always seeking to promote understanding of those decisions in the archdeaconry, parishes and across the Diocese.
- Every Diocesan Council Member is expected as they carry out their ministries to be intentional about walking the walk, partnering in living the Marks of Mission each day. Will seek to share God's blessing with others, eat with people, consciously listen to the Holy Spirit, actively learn about Christ and alert others to God's reign in all work that is attempted.

CONSTITUTION AND CANONS COMMITTEE/CHANCELLOR/VICE-CHANCELLOR

Mandate

The chancellor and vice-chancellor are appointed by and answerable to the appointing bishop personally. Their responsibility is advising the bishop, and by extension the synod and its council, on matters with legal resonance. Only in exceptional circumstances are they involved with the legal concerns of individual parish corporations. The offices are non-stipendiary.

The chancellor and vice-chancellor are ex officio members of the Synod's Constitution and Canons committee. As provided in Canon Four, the committee is appointed by the Diocesan Council to advise and make recommendations to the bishop, synod and council, particularly concerning diocesan and synod legislation. Current membership is: David Bell, Clarence Bennett, Rebecca Butler, David Edwards, Geoffrey Hall, Ross Hebb, Terry Hutchinson QC, Cathy Laskey, Siobhan Laskey, Barbara Richards, Deirdre Wade QC, Kelly VanBuskirk QC, and Ann Whiteway Brown QC.

Work

Now that the amended Anglican Church Act and correlative canonical changes are in place, committee of-the-whole work is not extensive. Nevertheless, experience is always suggesting further refinements to legislation either by way of remedying what is or crafting what should be. We continue to wrestle with the administrative mindset bequeathed to us by the Victorian church, by which each parish is a separate corporate island. Once a possible change is identified, draft language goes through a vetting process with the Constitution and Canons Committee and also the Administration Team before submission to Diocesan Council and eventually the Synod.

Beyond this, the two diocesan legal officers (chancellor and vice-chancellor) serve day-to-day legal needs in a variety of contexts:

- Drafting, including regulations and certain of the motions that come before Diocesan Council and Synod
- Property and trust issues
- Interpretation of diocesan legislation
- Advice on personnel matters
- Review of documents
- Legal counsel generally

We are fortunate indeed that Vice-Chancellor VanBuskirk has special expertise in employment and human rights law.

In January 2019 Canada's forty diocesan and provincial chancellors will meet in anticipation of for the forthcoming General Synod.

Particular thanks continue to be offered to ex-chancellors Ronald Stevenson, Charles Ferris and Clyde Spinney. They are consulted often and share the benefit of long experience.

PROPERTY COMMITTEE REPORT TO SYNOD 2018

Mandate

The Property Committee is accountable to the Finance Committee and the Bishop, assisting them to fulfill the requirements of the *Anglican Church Act, 2003* (*Act*) respecting the purchase, disposal and management of real property by the parishes, the Cathedral and the Synod. The Committee is guided by Canon 5, Canon 6, Diocesan Policy A-3, the Safe Church Regulations and direction from the Bishop and the Finance Committee. It also addresses issues previously managed by the Historic Properties Committee.

Membership includes up to five members of the Finance Committee (currently Finance Chair Gil Carter; Synod Treasurer Heather Harris-Jones; Dean Geoffrey Hall; Archdeacon Rob Marsh (Co-Chair, Property)), up to four other members (currently Archdeacon Rod Black, the Reverend Bob LeBlanc, Al Smith; Jim Knight (Chair)) and ex-officio members Bishop David Edwards and Executive Archdeacon Cathy Laskey.

General

The Committee openly invites discussions with parishes, the Cathedral and the Diocese with respect to their properties – purchases, sales, renovations, energy and other. With members with years of experience in the management of church capital purchases, sales or renovation projects, we offer specific technical advice where appropriate. When such projects so indicate, the Committee assists the Parish, Cathedral or Synod in having them properly approved as required under the *Act*, following processes described in Regulations, Policies and Directives issued under authority of the *Act*.

Property transactions are reviewed by the Committee resulting in recommendations being formally provided to the Finance Committee for their recommendation to the Bishop.

Recent Policy Work

The Committee has

- 1. developed amendments to Policy A-2 respecting the use of funds from the sale of residential properties;
- 2. provided advice to the Finance Committee and to the Human Resources Committee regarding potential amendments to the housing standards in Regulation 7-3;
- is in receipt of recommendations from the Chancellor for developing a new formal policy with respect to the operation and maintenance of church owned cemeteries; and
- 4. has identified that the Roles and Responsibilities of the Property Committee (circa May 16, 2007) and Policy A-3 (circa September 2003) are in need of review and updating.

Sale of Properties – General Direction

The Property Committee recently assisted the Diocese to develop specific directions to streamline the sale of properties in the Parish of St. Andrews and the Parish of Shediac.

Historic Properties

The Committee is currently working with the Archives Committee (historic properties generally), and with Fredericton Historic Properties Inc. (Holy Trinity, Lower St Mary's) and with New Maryland Heritage Association Inc. (St Mary the Virgin, New Maryland) with respect to potential restoration and possible repurposing of two closed churches.

HUMAN RESOURCES (STANDING) COMMITTEE

Pre-Retirement Conference

The pre-retirement conference took place on April 27-28 2018. Though we had intense flooding to contend with, the turnout was fantastic and the feedback has been extremely positive, despite ways to make the day run smoother internally. Following a dinner and panel discussion on the Friday Evening, Saturday was packed with informative presentations, laughter, food, and fellowship.

Throughout the whole process however, one thing became very clear. As a Diocese, we could be doing much more to support clergy through the entire retirement process. The HR Committee will continue the discussion on how this will look, but it was an essential topic for contemplation over this past summer.

Cannabis Legalization

Now that the legalization of marijuana in Canada appears to be a sure thing, the HR Committee decided that the policy at Camp Medley and Camp Brookwood would require immediate attention. Navigating these new waters required much follow-up with the appropriate people, but Camps' policy manuals have been updated to include the use of cannabis as it relates to the safety of everyone on the property.

The next step is to adopt the changes into Diocesan policy, which will require more work as it is not as straightforward as the Camp's policy.

Clergy Compensation Review

Surveys have been sent out to both parishes and clergy, with most having returned a few months ago. Irene Adams offered to continue the work she started on this project and have presentable results at the next HR Committee meeting (in September). This has been a long ongoing project and will be a relief to be able to move into next steps.

Safe Church Updates

With the transition of Ben Bourque into Personnel and Safe Church Officer, he has joined the HR Committee and provided updates on the Safe Church regulation. He has created a training video that has been far-reaching and allowed for many training sessions throughout the Diocese. As a result, over 1,000 training certificates have been added and good feedback has been received.

Revisions were made to the regulation in the fall of 2017 and passed by Diocesan Council. These changes have trickled down into the training and were mostly clarifying certain aspects of each policy.

A questionnaire was released from Ecclesiastical Insurance and all Parishes were to take part in submitting their responses. Marsh Canada Ltd collected the questionnaires on Ecclesiastical Insurance's behalf and we await the results.

Misconduct Complaints Officer and Complaint Investigation Training

Ann Whiteway Brown was appointed Misconduct Complaints Officer and has held the position since June of 2017. Complaint Investigation was held on May 12 & 13, 2017, though the attendees felt the workshop did not focus adequately on actual investigation procedures.

Annual Cost of Living and Mileage Reimbursement Evaluations

These two items have been reviewed year-over-year and those reviews have resulted in no change to the mileage reimbursement and a 2% cost of living increase to the minimum stipend scale.

Other items to be reviewed in the fall include honorariums and the retiree moving grant. These have not been reviewed for some time.

NOMINATING COMMITTEE

Mandate

The Nominating Committee is a standing committee of Diocesan Council with the purpose of facilitating the nominating process for specific vacancies in Diocesan representative roles, and ensuring elections and appointments are carried out as needed. The committee assists the Bishop and Diocesan Council in recruiting both clergy and lay persons for as many as 40 ministries within the Diocese. Within these areas of ministry, there are more than 250 roles for volunteers and Bishop's appointees within the diocese. Some are individual while many others serve as members on teams and committees.

Current members of the Nominating Committee include the Rt. Rev. David Edwards, the Ven. Cathy Laskey, Mr. Trevor Holder, Mr. Robert Taylor, the Rev. Canon Walter Williams and the Rev. Ann Fairweather. Members welcomed Robert Taylor, elected member of Diocesan Council, to the committee in January 2018. The Committee expresses its thanks to Mr. Frank Morehouse (Vice-chair), who faithfully served on the committee since January 2016 until his resignation in May 2018.

Election of Delegates to General Synod and Provincial Synod

The Nominating Committee organized the election of delegates and substitutes to General and Provincial Synod at the Nov 2016 Diocesan Synod. In response to feedback from prior Synods over the lack of knowledge about nominees to be elected, nominees were encouraged to prepare a 100 word, or less, statement to answer the question: Why do I want to be a delegate to Provincial Synod and/or General Synod? Of the 13 nominations from Greater Chapter Meetings, we were pleased that 12 nominees submitted responses for inclusion in delegates' registration packages. It was encouraging to have four youth nominations from the floor of Synod.

Appointments Diocesan Council Committees and Teams

With the appointment of the newly elected Diocesan Council in Nov 2017, the Nominating Committee assisted Diocesan Staff with the appointment of Diocesan Council members to standing committees, other committees and teams, based upon known vacancies and the skills and expressed interests of Council members.

Communication was initiated with Chairs 0and members of committees with no chairs, to gather information on members' desire for continued participation on respective Committees, Teams and Group. Vacancies were identified, and the majority of which have been filled by Diocesan Council members and Anglicans across our Diocese.

Communication with Committee, Team & Group Chairs

In March 2018 a memo was sent to Diocesan Committee, Team and Group Chairpersons to offer the Nominating Committee's assistance in filling vacancies and to seek assistance as well. It was stressed that "having a full complement of capable and committed members on committees and teams is our collective goal as well as ensuring that members represent our Diocese in terms of diversity of geographic area, gender and cultural demographics." Chairpersons were asked to advise us when a new member is needed along with some idea of the skill set that is needed and any other requirements they might have. Suggestions of skilled and interested people to fill the variety of volunteer opportunities within our Diocesan committees, teams, groups and individual roles was also mentioned.

ARCHIVES

Mandate

The work of the Diocesan Archives Committee is to collect, store and make available the relevant historical documentation of the life of the Diocese of Fredericton. This is facilitated by a relationship with the Provincial Archives of New Brunswick. *Note that the mandate is currently under review.

Digitization

Perhaps the most exciting work that is being pursued by the Committee is the digitization of church registers. In partnership with the Provincial Archives (who were provided with \$9000 to hire a person to facilitate the work), all birth, marriage and burial registers will be digitized. Records will be made available online in accordance with the same restrictions put on census records (up to 1921). Confirmation records will also be digitized but will not be a priority for online access.

Due to obstacles in putting the material on the PANB website in the immediate future, we are pursuing the possibility of working with the New Brunswick Genealogical Society (NBGS) which has a keen interest, the technology, and the people-power not only to put the digital copies on their website but also to enable members of the public to volunteer to transcribe the registers online. This initiative, referred to as "crowd-sourcing," will make it possible to keyword-search the information in the volumes, which will be an incredible boon to all interested parties.

Parish Records

The Committee is putting special emphasis on making sure that churches that are closing or considering closure notify the Archivist so that arrangements can be made to transfer archival records to the Provincial Archives. The intent is to reassure those closing churches that the records will remain accessible and looked after, and also to ensure that records of value are not unintentionally overlooked.

Inventory of Archival Records

Sarah Cooper was hired by the Provincial Archives to continue working on the inventory of parish records. This work is being done to confirm accuracy, facilitate research, standardize formatting, and to ensure that the inventory can be revised/updated more easily in the future. The inventory is currently at 1100+ pages and there are 1217 containers in the Archives' repository. In other words, if all the boxes were lined up, they would stretch for 250 metres.

BISHOP'S COURT PILOT PROJECT (DISCIPLESHIP HOUSE)

The Discipleship House, located at Bishop's Court, has been in operation for three years. There have been growing pains in these years, but they have been successful years. People's lives have been changed, their faith in Jesus deepened, their commitment to mission bolstered. Over the past three years we have learned how to carry out the administrative aspects of running a Discipleship House. We have

moved from being Christian individuals living in the same place to an intentional community that prays together and lives together to the glory of God.

In a sense the Discipleship House began as a pilot project and continues to be so. Our vision has adjusted with time and of late we have been discerning which direction to take. Originally we had hoped that the Discipleship House would welcome Christian students entering university, so that together, and under the supervision of House Mentors they would grow in maturity as disciples of Jesus. They would learn about long-suffering love, spiritual practices and disciplines, and they would study the Bible together. Fruit from this intentional community would be mutually beneficial partnerships with local churches, and new missional and evangelistic activity in Fredericton.

We started wrestling with this vision last year. We questioned whether the Discipleship House should consist primarily of Christians still young and inexperienced in their faith, or if it should focus instead on more mature Christians who would minister to their younger brothers and sisters. A key way such ministry would take place would be by modelling the Christian life in community. The focus would remain the same: to disciple our young people as they go through University. The means however would potentially look different. Discussing this issue has raised many other questions as well, such as, "Could an intentional Christian Community exist while its members did not live together in one building?" What would such a community look like?

There is a need for clarity of our vision. As such we have decided that this year, rather than opening Bishop's Court as a Discipleship House for a fourth year - we are going to take time to wrestle with these issues. We are going to identify like-minded people who might be drawn to some form of covenanted Christian Community. We are going to connect with young Anglicans in the Diocese in order to pray and discern what needs there are and how we can meet those needs.

It is our sincere hope that by stepping back to pray through these issues, we will be better equipped to focused to minister to young people in Fredericton (and beyond).

Communications Strategy

The logo and shield are in the final stages of design as I write this. We hope to have them ready for Diocesan Synod in November.

Future of Anglican Newspapers

Communications officer Gisele McKnight has kept us apprised of the CoGS working group and its future plans for our newspapers. It sent two people to the Anglican Editors Association conference this year to bring editors up to date, which Gisele shared with us.

Their main message was a plan to eliminate print newspapers in favour of online only within three to five years.

This will likely be in the form of a motion on the floor of General Synod in July 2019. It will have a huge impact on every diocese with a print newspaper and on older readers as well..

PROVINCIAL SYNOD REPORT

The 48th Session of the Synod of the Ecclesiastical Province of Canada, encompassing all Dioceses from Quebec eastward, was held at Kings College, Halifax, from June 8th to 10th, 2018. The Diocese of Fredericton was represented by Bishop David Edwards, Rev. Christian Persaud, Rev. Ted Quann, Colton Scott (Youth) and Robert Taylor (Lay). Peter Irish was also in attendance as the Provincial Treasurer, a role to which he was re-elected. This Synod was pared down in size, each Diocese having only two clerical and two lay representatives along with a youth delegate, and also in length, being three days instead of four. Consequently, the schedule was tightly packed – five presentations and discussion groups in just under thirty hours proved to be mentally challenging.

The opening session and Eucharist were held in the beautiful surroundings of the Kings College Chapel, whose pews face each other in the English choral tradition. The opening session outlined the Provincial Safe Church Regulation, which largely follows the Fredericton model, as our Diocese seems to be the most advanced in its implementation. All Synod delegates were required to take Safe Church training (amounting to nearly 200 pages of reading) and quiz on-line prior to Synod. At the Eucharist, the new Metropolitan, Bishop Ron Cutler, gave the Charge, known as the Presidential Address. He emphasized the theme of the Synod as missional leadership, or intentional discipleship. He noted that all of the Dioceses across Canada started off as missions, under the supervision of the Church of England. It is the intentional mission of the Church to "go and make disciples". He also stressed the importance of parishes engaging with their communities. Bishops used to say to their clerics, "Here is a parish – go take care of it." Now they say, "Here is a parish – go build it."

The initial business items -- sessional committees, minutes, correspondence, reports, notices of motion -- were dispatched quickly, giving Primate Fred Hiltz, who attended

the full weekend, time to talk about the emphases of General Synod in July 2019. These will include the election of a new Primate, consideration of the next steps in self-determination for indigenous people, and second reading of the proposed revised Marriage Canon, which would have to pass by two-thirds majority in each House. The Primate stressed the need for pastoral empathy both during and after the debate and the vote, for some will be happy and some won't with either result. A short evening session talked about this issue. The Marriage Commission, in its report "This Holy Estate", examines the question, Is Holy Matrimony the appropriate vehicle to celebrate and affirm same-sex marriages? The "male – female" theology of Genesis is set over against the more inclusive "love one another" theology of Ephesians.

All of the above, plus group discussion of the Metropolitan's address, occurred on Friday between 2 and 9 pm – did I mention that the agenda was tightly packed? Saturday morning the pace resumed with the Primate further developing the subject of missional leadership. He announced a nation-wide grass-roots forum called "The Heartbeat of the Church", based on John 15:12-17 and exploring in groups the questions "Describe a time when our church made your heart glad / made your heart ache / gave you hope".

Other Saturday presentations on the Synod theme were made by Judy Rois, Executive Director of the Anglican Foundation; Eileen Scully, Director of Faith, Education and Ministry; and Zach Ingalls on behalf of Fresh Expressions Canada. The latter two were followed by further discussion groups.

The closing Eucharist was held at All Saints Cathedral, with the Primate as Celebrant. It coincided with the Sunday School closing. The Senior Church School led most of the parts of the service except the sermon and the parts that the Celebrant must do. They even had special permission to administer the bread and wine. And, it being the Church School closing, there was the added attraction of sharing a delicious buffet lunch with the Cathedral congregation.

The next Provincial Synod would normally happen in 2021. This may or may not occur, as this latest Synod adopted a Constitutional amendment that means it does not have to meet every third year. A second motion (not a Constitutional amendment) allows it to meet virtually, meaning delegates from a Diocese might meet in one location and "call in" to the central meeting. A third motion reimburses to Dioceses whatever is saved in travel and facility costs if the Synod meets "virtually" rather than physically. And a final motion places the responsibility for ministry back with the Dioceses, with corresponding reduction in the Province's budget.

FREDERICTON HOSPITAL CHAPLAINCY

It is with a great deal of satisfaction that I write this report to you about the important and necessary work of Chaplaincy at the Doctor Everett Chalmers Hospital, Fredericton, NB.

At the end of July, 2017, I stepped down as priest in charge of the Parish of Bright after ten years. I thought it time to take a second retirement. It was at that time in July 2017 that Canon Walter Williams resigned as Chaplain of the DECH, Fredericton. Hospital Chaplaincy......that seemed to tweak my interest. It was something that I thought would be nice to do.....and to be part of my ministry before I REALLY retired. I believe that God was calling me to pursue this ministry, and after some prayerful consideration, I decided to make my intent known to Bishop David. You know the rest of the story, and I was appointed Chaplain at DECH, effective October 1, 2017.

I am delighted and thankful to God every day for the honour and privilege to visit our Anglican residents at the Chalmers Hospital. As I understand it, the Chaplaincy at the hospital was established back in the early eighties. (83-85) with the hope of having a Chaplain to visit people from outside of Fredericton proper..... people from the Parishes of Stanley, Bright, Cambridge and Waterborough, Minto-Chipman, New Maryland, Oromocto, Prince William, Gagetown, Ludlow and Blissfield and Fredericton Junction. Occasionally there are people from outside the jurisdiction of the Archdeaconry of Fredericton and York that are patients at the hospital as well. It is a good opportunity and a vital ministry to people in times of sickness/illness. Believe it or not, some love and pastoral care is wanted/needed, and appreciated by those in hospital. It never ceases to amaze me how much people want prayer and God's blessing. It gives them comfort, strength, and peace. As is often said, "thank you for coming, thank you for prayer, thank you for my Holy Communion., I feel so much better now." We live trusting in God, and we die trusting in God.

From October to the end December – 2017, I was able to make 171 calls. Some patients are visited two, three or four times depending on their stay in hospital. From January to August, 2018, I have made 477 calls. Generally my visiting days are Tuesday and Thursday.

There are times when I'm called in for emergency cases....like this past week or so with the shooting and death of two Police Officers, and two civilians/citizens here in Fredericton. A terrible tragedy.

Outside of the Hospital Chaplaincy, I go once or twice a month to Hospice Fredericton to visit with all patients there. This too, is a rewarding ministry for sure, sharing and ministering to others in their final days of life. I have been truly blessed by many patients at Hospice, and the hope that they have for eternal life in Christ Jesus, Our Lord. As one man said to me a while ago, "John, I know that Jesus is going to come along soon, and stop at the foot of my bed, and reach out and take my big toe, and say, "it is time for your to come home, come with me" and I will say, 'yes Jesus and get out of my way, I don't want to run over you." To die in the Lord is the hope of all of us. Amen.

I might say, that two other clergy, Canon Tom Smith and the Rev. Arnold Godsoe share with me the Hospice Fredericton visitation. We do that every Thursday during the month each having a day. Families of loved ones and Hospice Fredericton, Doctors and Staff are most appreciative of our ministry/pastoral care in this facility.

Also, I do visits to the DVA next door to the Chalmers Hospital. There are a number of Veterans and they are always pleased to have a visit. There several Anglicans and

on occasion I bring the Blessed Sacrament to those who desire to have their communion.

I am involved with Pastoral Care Department as well and attend some meetings, and conferences. The Reverend Adrian David is the administrator and full time worker for Spiritual and Pastoral Care at the DECH. He is most supportive of our Chaplaincy and is a very caring and faithful servant.

There are always changes taking place, like anywhere else. Spiritual and Pastoral Care is no exception---Privacy is a big issue at the hospital, and one has to be very careful. Information is not always easy to obtain. There is a lot of control. One thing I have noticed and have also addressed is the fact that several people who are Anglican do not appear on the Pastoral Care list, and as a result, are not visited or missed when they are in hospital. This can be very frustrating for people and for patients who generally are looking for a visit from the Rector/Clergy. I have taken the liberty of having names added for a clergy visit with the consent of the family and patient of course.

Please impress upon all our people—Anglican for sure that when and if they have to be a patient in hospital that they make it known to the admitting clerk that a visit from the Clergy is requested and wanted.

I will continue to keep Rectors/Clergy informed of any members of their congregation is in hospital. The Clergy in Fredericton are very committed to visiting their people, and have been very supportive of me as Chaplain. I am thankful to all my brothers and sisters for this.

LAYREADERS

Mandate

Layreaders in the Diocese of Fredericton are called to an important and vital part of the ministry of the church. They actively participate in liturgical and pastoral work and the mission of God in the world. Currently there are 31 layreaders-in-training as well as 94 diocesan and 204 parochial layreaders for a total of 329 layreaders assisting in the diocese.

Purpose

The main purpose of layreaders as worship leaders is to set a tone of grace - and by their leadership support the congregation's worship and the ministry of the Incumbent. It is an opportunity to serve the church, connect the worship experience to each other, and experience spiritual growth. The duties of a layreader will vary according to parish needs. Typically, they perform such functions as reading lessons, leading the prayers of the people, sharing leadership, and planning for public worship services. When appropriately trained, layreaders may be called upon for more extensive ministry, preparing and officiating services of Morning and Evening Prayer in their own parish, or in another parish, including giving a homily or sermon. They may take on leadership roles in parish events, committees, training sessions or taking home Communion to the sick or shut-ins. To that end the training

program for layreaders that started in 2015 has seen much growth and continues to mature.

Layreader Training Program

Core foundational layreader courses are designed to provide layreaders with a basic understanding of scripture, liturgy, worship, doctrine, history, leadership and preaching. One course titled "Leading Worship as a Layreader" has been added to the Anglican worship stream.

To date, all core foundational courses have been developed with the exception of the session relating to the Book of Common Prayer. Required courses for layreaders-intraining as well as continuing education courses for parochial and diocesan layreaders, include:

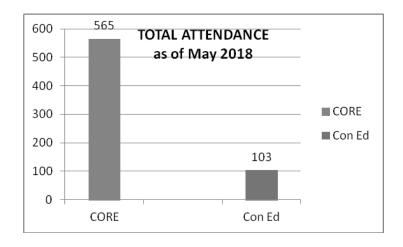
- Reading Scripture & Liturgy in Public (Bishop Edwards)
- Biblical Foundations (Bishop Edwards)
- Church Doctrine (Bishop Edwards)
- Introduction to Sermon Preparation (Bishop Hockin)
- Church History: The Reformation (Canon Dr. Ross Hebb)
- Leadership Foundations (Bishop Edwards)
- Anglican Worship:
 - The Lord's Prayer (Bishop Hockin)
 - Prayers of the People (Rev. David Peer)
 - Unpacking the Creeds (Rev. Terence Chandra)
 - Leading Worship as a Layreader (Rev. David Peer)
 - The Book of Common Prayer (to be developed)
 - Spiritual Disciplines & Practices (Rev. Thomas Nesbitt)

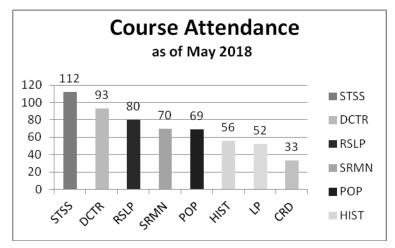
Parochial and diocesan layreaders are strongly encouraged to participate in the courses to receive new information and to mentor new layreaders.

To date one continuing education course has been developed titled S.H.A.P.E. - Your Shape for God's Service as a discernment course designed to help determine layreaders spiritual gifts. Other continuing education opportunities include the Gospel and Culture video presentation by Bishop Edwards (May 2017) with a session titled Becoming a Missional Person for a Missional Parish planned for the spring of 2019. Any and all book studies, courses, programs, or education events are considered continuing education.

All core and continuing education course information is available on the layreader website. Facilitator toolkits as well as information to deliver courses is available on both the layreader and clergy resource websites. All courses have been developed to be given in small group format as well as through self-study.

Over the past 2 years there have been 565 attendees at core training events and 103 at continuing education events. Training is ongoing with small group and self study formats steadily growing.

All layreader programs or courses being offered are advertised through:

- the Lavreader Site
- the Diocesan Event Calendar
- the Archdeaconry Layreaders representative
- Diocesan eNews

Layreaders have been diligent in providing feedback through an evaluation process. Overall ratings for the courses and workshops attended remain at 4.5 on a Likert five point agreement scale with 5 being classified as being very pleased. Comments provided by layreaders through evaluations have been appreciated and have helped frame and improve the development and delivery of new courses.

Feedback has been very positive from clergy and layreaders about the value of the self-assessment process and initiation of layreader covenants, both of which have provided an opportunity to discuss the layreader ministry with respect to roles and

gift discernment at the parish level. Another area of importance and value has been the development and presentation of Layreader Emeritus certificates - which replaces the Bishop's List - recognizing layreaders who have chosen to retire.

So Parish Clergy were reminded to announce that members should call the church to let us know when loved ones were admitted to the hospital. In my case, I would ask that Anglicans from out-of-town to call me (506-857-8826) and let me know when they have anyone in the hospital in Moncton.

I have greatly enjoyed my work as Chaplain and will continue to do so, by God's grace.

- looking for and promoting new mission and outreach initiatives within and beyond the diocese.

Overview of activity in 2017

I accepted the Bishop's invitation to Chair the Mission & Outreach Team in January 2017 and followed his direction to work with Ken Nielson, Parish Development Officer, to revive and/or re-configure the MO Team. Ken and I met several times early in the year to discuss how to move forward.

The Admin Team noted a lot of overlap with the Spiritual Development and Stewardship Teams, so the Bishop asked us to consider merging. The chairs of the three teams, plus Ken Nielson, met on April 26 and proposed a merger that would involve re-structuring the ministry of the Diocese. This proposal was been submitted to the Admin Team for their consideration and follow-up.

When Ken resigned his position in the Fall, the Bishop advised me to work with the Spiritual Development Team. I joined them for their meeting in November.

Overview of activity in 2018

The appointment of Shawn Branch as the Parish Development Officer and the subsequent addition of members have provided a new opportunity to consider the future of the MO Team. We have met regularly since February, affirming the mandate set by Diocesan Council, while also seeking to discern what meaningful role we should have with the various Diocesan Groups that are linked with the MO Team. We have contacted each of these groups asking for their input. We have also contacted the mission and outreach groups at the parish level to make them aware that the MO Team has been revived and that Shawn will act as our liaison with them. We have also been discussing the possibility of holding

Christian Forums at UNB, Fredericton campus, as well as considering other outreach initiatives for the Diocese.

Future Activity

- Review the input we receive from the Diocesan Groups and decide what role we should have to encourage and support their work.
- Respond to input or requests that Shawn may bring to us from parish groups.
- Confirm plans for a Christian Forum to be held in October at Christ Church Parish Church (mid-day) and at UNB (evening). Speaker: Dr. Alan Sears, UNB professor and member of Christ Church Cathedral. Topic: Christians in the Public Square. Look for details in announcements in the coming weeks.
- Explore other topics and speakers for Christian Forums.
- Explore other initiatives, i.e. partnering with Wycliffe College to live stream parts of Wycliffe's Religion and Society Series.

I am grateful for the opportunity to serve God and the Diocese in this capacity. I am also grateful for the members of the MO Team for their input and encouragement as we seek to discern a meaningful role for the MO Team. Please pray with us for God's direction in the coming year.

CENTRAL SAINT JOHN COMMUNITY MINISTRY

Central Saint John Community Ministry is dedicated to serving the people of the city of Saint John by walking with them in various needs, by providing opportunities and spaces to build relationships, and by offering hope through the power of Christ. By moving into the neighbourhood, connecting with churches and non-profits as well as forming mutual relationships with marginalized people, we hope to provide a link between the church and the community so that we can authentically share the Good News of hope and joy that is found in Jesus.

In the 4 years since we began this ministry we have formed a few programs to address some of the observed needs around us. We also partner with various organizations who are already hard at work in the community. By supporting their efforts, we hope to build connections and support ongoing efforts to build up our city.

Our Programs:

<u>ESL Bible Study:</u> The Bible is a great tool for learning languages! This study is for newcomers who want to learn English as well as more about God. Each lesson comes with conversation about the passage and a list of new vocabulary words. This has been a very meaningful time for those who attend.

<u>The Emmaus Way:</u> We have found that there is a poverty of relationship that exists in the city. There are those who are in unstable circumstances that do not have the necessary support systems to help them get through a tough time. In this program we build a team around an individual or family who needs extra support so that no one walks alone. <u>Kidstart SJ:</u> Kids know that they can make a difference but often are not given the opportunity to do so. This 12 week program get kids thinking about how they can develop their communities. We tour 8 non-profit organizations then design and implement a way to either fundraise, volunteer, or advocate for that organization.

<u>Drop-in:</u> this weekly program providing members of the community with refreshments and a chance to relax and have fun.

<u>Youth Connection:</u> Along with Inner City Youth and the Vineyard church we run a weekly youth program for students in grades 6-12. We begin with supper and then have activities and a chance to talk about the deeper things in life.

How we Partner in the Community:

- We help out in various programs including: E.L.F, Pathways to Education, Waterloo Village Street Outreach, The Food Purchasing Club, Sophia Recovery Centre, and The Saint John Multicultural and Newcomers Resource Centre.
- We also volunteer on a number of boards: the Greater Saint John Food Security Group, Safe Harbour, KAIROS, Uptown Ministerial, the Elizabeth Fry Society, and IARCM.
- We attend community meals and build relationships with those around us and those who live with us in our apartment building. Highlights of these relationships have been: blessing an apartment for someone we met at Romero House, helping a single mom in need, working with a young man suffering from PTSD, a memorial service for someone who passed away in our building, helping someone begin their journey to recovery from addictions, helping people through the 5th step of AA.

Financials:

We are funded partly by the Diocese of Fredericton (\$20,000) with contributions from Stone Church. The remaining 65% (about \$50,000 a year) we raise through the donations of individuals and parishes. In God's incredible provision the needed funding has always come in.

Past Work of the Committee

The two diocese's have been working together for a few years. In the past one of the more successful projects was a corn milling project for a number of villages in the Diocese of Ho. Funds were also sent to The Diocese of Ho towards transportation for Bishop Matthias.

Earlier this year, Heather Miller retired as the Chair of the committee. The nominating committee replaced Heather with Robert Griffin, who has been on three mission trips to Guinea, in Western Africa. He assisted with the construction of a hospital in the Prefecture of Boffa, on land owned by the Diocese of Guinea, under Bishop Jacques Boston.

Looking Forward

This summer, the committee has reconnected with Bishop Matthias. A group of three or four from the Diocese of Fredericton will travel to Ghana, hopefully in February of 2019. The purpose of the trip will be to do a needs assessment, as to what we can do best to help the Diocese of Ho in their service for Christ.

Parish Nursing

Mandate

"Parish Nursing is a health ministry which emphasizes the wholeness of body, mind and spirit. Rooted in the vision of Christ as Healer, this ministry grows out of the belief that all faith communities are places of health and healing and have a role in promoting wholeness through the integration of faith and health." – Canadian Association of Parish Nurse Ministries (CAPNM) website http://www.capnm.ca

Parish Nursing ministries are currently active in two faith communities within the diocese of Fredericton

- Kathleen Snow ministers at Christ Church Cathedral in Fredericton, and
- Cleo Cyr ministers at Holy Trinity in the Parish of Hammond River in Quispamsis.

Betty Steeves has taken a leave this year as Parish Nurse for St. Martin-in-the-Woods parish in Shediac Cape due to other commitments. Beth Lawson has retired as Parish Nurse from Trinity Church in Saint John. There is a Health Ministry team at St. Margaret's Church in Fredericton, where Faith Cormier is active as a Parish Nurse Associate, and Nancy Wiggins as a retired Parish Nurse.

Current Activities and Blessings to the Cathedral Congregation

Kathleen Snow has been working part-time in a salaried position at Christ Church Cathedral since September of 2016. Kathleen coordinates an active Health Ministry Team which offers many programs and ministries to the Cathedral congregation including Prayer Shawl ministry, Blood Pressure Clinics, Helping Hands, Thursday Afternoon Teas, Cathedral Visitors, Health Promotion sessions and Fitness and Yoga classes.

The Parish Nurse role also reaches out to the wider community doing client assessments and counseling at the Monday Morning Drop In Outreach Program. Kathleen holds regular Blood Pressure Clinics at St. Margaret's church every several months with the assistance of Faith Cormier of their Health Ministry Team. She also holds a Blood Pressure Clinic every several months at the Tuesday Morning Coffee at St. Margaret's.

Kathleen advocates for her clients, referring them to other health care providers as needed. She visits clients in their home setting to counsel or perform home assessments and visits clients in hospital to support or assist with discharge planning. She frequently attends physician visits with her clients in a supportive role and offers counselling to them or their families.

Kathleen provides consultation and counseling on a daily basis to members of the Cathedral congregation. She is an active member of the Home Communicants Team. Prayer is a vital component to the Parish Nurse's ministry.

The Parish Nurse is also involved in the implementation of the Safe Church Regulation for the Cathedral congregation as an active member of the Safe Church Team.

Current Activities and Blessings to the Holy Trinity Parish of Hammond River Congregation

Cleo Cyr has held a very well supported volunteer position as Parish Nurse with the Parish of Hammond River since November 2016. She coordinates an active Health Ministry Team and regularly facilitates health information workshops. As needed she engages in home visitation and coordinates the transportation needs of rural parishioners attending physician and hospital appointments as well as church services both at Holy Trinity and Shannex. Realizing the importance of prayer with respect to health and wellness, Cleo facilitates an active Prayer Shawl Ministry Group who meet monthly. As well as supplying the Saint John Regional Hospital chaplain with prayer shawls for distribution to the ill and infirmed, prayer shawls are also made with love and care and given to many within the community who need to be 'wrapped in prayer'. Cleo also facilitates a monthly Outreach Soup Mission which involves 15 families making soup and delivering it to the Romero House Soup Kitchen. This ministry includes soup delivery to shut-ins.

With the kind assistance of the Parish of Hammond River and the Parish of Shediac, Cleo completed an Advanced Diabetic Foot Care Management Course in 2017. She now provides at home foot care and foot care clinics within the parish as well as volunteer advanced foot care and outreach at the Romero House Soup Kitchen, the St. Luke's North End 'Loaves and Fishes Program', the Oasis Women's Group held at the Outflow Shelter on Waterloo St., and the Vineyard Church Mission - also in Saint John. In June a parish 'Shoe Drive' saw the collection of 8 large bags of shoes delivered to many of these programs.

Canadian Association of Parish Nurse Ministries (CAPNM)

A core group of six Parish Nurses from the Fredericton area met and organized the National CAPNM AGM Conference which was held in Fredericton in June of 2017. Three members of the Cathedral's Parish Nurse Team as well as Parish Nurses from two other churches in the Fredericton area participated in the planning and coordination of the conference. The theme of the conference was *Coming Alongside with the Holy Spirit*. The conference was well attended with 54 Parish Nurses in attendance from across Canada and one from England. In

May of 2018 Kathleen Snow and Faith Cormier attended the CAPNM AGM in Edmonton. Faith is a current member of the national board of CAPNM.

New Brunswick Association of Parish Nurse Ministries (NBPNM)

The New Brunswick Association of Parish Nurse Ministries (NBPNM) is an association of approximately 20 Parish Nurses/Parish Nurse Associates from different denominations within New Brunswick. Several members of the diocese of Fredericton sit on the NBPNM executive.

Members meet 1-2 times annually to share with one another in the work of their ministries, share in a spiritual program/retreat, and hold a business meeting. The NBPMN is currently drafting a NBPNM Constitution and By-laws for the association. It is anticipated that a Basic Parish Nurse Education Program will be planned in the near future to train new Parish Nurses within the province for this important ministry.

We wish to express our thanks to Bishop Edwards and the diocese for their ongoing annual monetary support to the New Brunswick Anglican Parish Nurses.

SAINT JOHN SEAFARERS MISSION

Mandate

Eric Phinney is the Chaplain for the Port of Saint John and the Saint John Seafarers Mission. The Saint John Seafarers Mission is also an official Station for Mission to Seafarers Canada which is a mission of General Synod and is chaired by the Primate. Eric also serves on the executive of MTS Canada. We currently do not have an Anglican representative on the Board of Directors.

This ecumenical ministry in the Port of Saint John continues to be blessed with growth and effective ministry to over 2,400 seafarers who visit annually at their facility adjacent to the main gate of the Port on the west side of the city.

The facility has been expanded to include a small chapel area. The facility is also used by "West Side Anglican Mission". Ship Visiting is normally done by Rev. Eric Phinney (Port Chaplain). In his absence this winter visits will be conducted by Rev. Jonathan Springthorp.. They have excellent hosts during the week to welcome their guests, most of whom come to use the internet and take advantage of our free Van Service for visits o local shopping and recreation. The mission building now includes an area devoted to the use of lap- tops. A big screen TV is available with a news feed service specifically tailored to the needs of seafarers. They have a shuttle service by which seafarers are transported to shopping areas in the city and to the Mission it- self. This has enabled their outreach to extend more than before to the Courtney Bay area to service the crews on the oil tankers and at the Potash Terminal in East Saint John.

Recently wifi service has been established at the Irving Oil terminals and the Potash terminal. The vision going forward will be to ensure quality wifi at every berth in the port.

Our chaplains and volunteers are always alert to more serious welfare and justice needs as we go about providing the basics of transportation and communication.

Goal for the next five years:

- To establish wifi throughout the whole port
- To find some volunteer van driver
- To develop a package holding and delivery service
- To facilitate other needs of the seafarers.

The current needs are for more funding and volunteers.

SPIRITUAL DEVELOPMENT

Mandate

The Spiritual Development team's mandate is to oversee, encourage, inspire, and enable communication by and with the groups within our cluster and to organize and/or promote special spiritual development (formation) initiatives.

Prayer Initiative

The team continues to work on developing and promoting opportunities aimed at increasing the understanding and practice of prayer among Anglicans in the diocese.

- The book Noticing God, by Richard Peace, was recommended as a personal and parish group study for Lent 2017 and Pray Reflections on the Lord's Prayer, by Bishop Bill Hockin, for Lent 2018. The response from parishes to the Lenten study suggestion continues to be very good.
- A prayer retreat day was held in June 2017. Another planned for May of this year was cancelled due to low registration.
- The team has offered to facilitate a retreat for the new Diocesan Council.
- The Rev. Debbie Edmondson continues as diocesan representative for the Anglican Fellowship of Prayer and is developing a network of parish representatives.
- An online prayer resource inventory, now located on the new diocesan website, continues to be updated.
- The team will again facilitate an on-site and parish prayer vigils for this Synod.

Spiritual Formation Initiatives

Other initiatives underway to promote personal and parish spiritual growth include:

- In conjunction with the Parish Development Officer, support and development of resources for the Surprise the World (BELLS) initiative.
- In conjunction with other Teams, the organization of an annual or bi-annual diocesan ministry conference, which would include a keynote speaker and a variety of workshops on ministry and discipleship related themes. The first of these will be held next June with Michael Frost, author of Surprise the World, as our keynote.

Bishop's Pilgrimage

Members of the team oversaw the planning and execution of Bishop David's 3rd and 4th pilgrimages, in the Archdeaconries of Moncton and Woodstock, respectively. In both cases, church members were very supportive with very few kilometers where Bishop David and Trevor were on their own and with many out to services and suppers. Next year's pilgrimage will cover the combined Archdeaconries of Saint John and Kingston and the Kennebecasis, approximately during the first half of June. Particular thanks to Trevor who continues to look after route planning and accompanies the bishop for the full pilgrimage. DIOCESAN CHOIR SCHOOL

Choir School's Ministry

Choir School's ministry to the greater Church is to enhance the gifts of sacred choral singing in the Anglican tradition in those who attend each year. Choir School takes place each July for a week at Rothesay-Netherwood School in Rothesay, NB. Junior choristers aged 8-18 come for the whole week, while adult choristers join totem on The Thursday evening, after a Choral Evensong service at a local church, for the weekend. A Festal Choral Evensong service is offered on the final Sunday afternoon, usually at Trinity Church in uptown Saint John. Over the past two years we have welcomed, on average, 25 children and 40 adults,

along with 10-12 counselling staff and 12 support staff, making for a total choir of roughly 85-90 singers.

2017 - Our 60th Anniversary

This year we gave particular thanks to God Almighty for 60 years of continuous music ministry. We marked this occasion with a Thursday Choral Evensong at Trinity Church, uptown Saint John, and our final service, a Festal Choral Evensong service, at Christ Church Cathedral in Fredericton. Past favourites and festive music were an important part of the service that year.

We also instituted a first - the first Hymn Competition. A \$1,500 prize was offered to a winning hymn that would be available for use throughout the Diocese. This hymn would be usable by churches anywhere, regardless of the music resources available to them.

2018 - the Ministry Continues...

This past summer saw the continuation of Choir School ministry. We continue to welcome new choristers each year, and are excited by the new musical things going on in various parishes of the Diocese. There are many stories to share!

At our Choral Evensong this year, we were thrilled to offer the world premiere performance of "Sing Unto God", the winning hymn in our first Hymn Competition that was run last year. The music, written by David Buley, and text by his wife, Jan, is a beautiful hymn of praise and thanksgiving to God for the beautiful creation in which we live. David has also served as our adult clinician over the past two years. It was a thrill to be be able to sing this new hymn, with David directing, and to be able to offer it to the entire Diocese.

Choir School continues to grow. With new faces on our Planning Team, new ideas, and new ways to worship through song, there is much for Choir School to experience and offer each other. As we welcome people from multiple dioceses, denominations, and backgrounds, the diversity of Choir School is a great gift which, prayerfully, will serve it and everyone well for years to come.

Thanks be to God for all that He has given us, particularly the gift of music.

Mothers' Union

Mandate

The Diocese of Fredericton Mothers' Union is part of a larger worldwide organization which works towards the vision of a world where God's love is shown through loving, respectful and flourishing relationships. Our objectives include: promoting and supporting married life, encouraging parents in developing the faith of their children, maintaining a worldwide fellowship in prayer, service and worship, promoting conditions for a stable family life and helping families in adversity.

In New Brunswick, our current Mothers' Union membership is just over 100 members. We have 8 different Mothers' Union branches. Each branch conducts its business and programs according to their needs and preferences. We have a diocesan council which assists the

branches, plans diocesan events and helps to maintain relationships with our national council and the worldwide organization.

Current Happenings

Branch Level: Each of our branches continue to be active participants in the lives of their parishes and communities. It is hoped that each branch recognizes the needs within their own community and does their part to address them. These may include: support through baptism/confirmation, meal programs, parish celebrations, Sunday School and nursery support and others.

Diocesan Level: As a diocese, our Mothers' Union members gather on an annual basis for our rally. These rallies allow us to inform our members, worship and learn together and an excellent opportunity for fellowship. In 2017 our rally took place at St. John the Baptist in Riverview and in 2018 it took place at Trinity Church in Sussex. The development of the parenting program continues in several of our branches. We also contribute to the activities of Family Camp at Camp Medley each summer. Through the leadership of fun activities, developed by our branches, we hope to promote family fun and bonding.

MULOA: Throughout 2017-2018 several of our memberships participated in two separate workshops with Mothers' Union members from around the world (Zone B). These were entitled MULOA or Mothers' Union Listening Observing Acting. We focussed on developing the goals and framework for the work of Mothers' Union in the next decade. The first of these workshops took place in the Barbados and the second at the Villa Madonna in Rothesay. We were honoured to host our Mothers' Union friends from countries like the United States, Australia, West Indies, England, Hong Kong and many more.

National and Worldwide Leadership: Our current National Mothers' Union Council is made up of many of our New Brunswick Members. They work to oversee and develop Mothers' Union in Canada and we are very proud of their work. Our current National President is Alice Kennedy from Hampton. We are also blessed by the work of Kathleen Snow who is a part of the worldwide Mothers' Union leadership groups.

DIOCESAN RESOURCE CENTRE

Following the relocation of the Diocesan Resource Centre from Princess Street in Saint John to Threshold House on Mountain View Drive in 2015 the materials were vigorously sorted. VHS and cassette tapes, along with other outdated resources were removed. The Resource Centre Materials and those of the Threshold Library were joined together with excess materials being given to other groups.

At this point over the next two years the Resource Centre materials were brought into line with the other library materials and all the books and DVD's began to be catalogued together under the same call number system. This would not have been possible without volunteers and summer student help.

Up to this point resources could only be borrowed by visiting Threshold Library in Saint John. It was decided to make the resources more accessible by putting them onto a computer. This meant access to the resources were available on both the Diocesan and Threshold websites. This was another mammoth task. Thanks needs to be extended to Minna Harjupanula who both supervised the summer student that year, and continued with this task of programing the data base once a week for the next year and a half.

By the Spring of 2018 the basic information details of title and author were all recorded for both books and DVD materials and all that remained to be finished were the Call numbers for the DVD's. This has now been finished by this year's summer student.

The Diocesan Collection in the Library has a total of 775 items – both historic and new-(including books, CD's and DVD's). At present 66 individuals use the library. Resources can be personally collected, delivered through the Synod Office or where there is no other alternative through the mail.

Amongst the many new resources one particularly popular book/DVD this year has been 'Just 10' by J John (a series of discussions on the 10 Commandments) which has been used in a variety of Bible Studies/ Discussion Groups across the Diocese. This epitomizes the value of a Resource Centre which offers relevant and up to date materials for our churches as we aim to develop and grow our spiritual base.

In conclusion I wish to thank all those who have helped me with the Resource Centre in whatever capacity, no task has been too small or insignificant.

Leader Training

One of our main mandates is to equip youth leaders with training to contemporary and innovative youth ministry practices. Over the last two years YIG and youth leaders have taken part in the following conferences and workshops:

- Canadian Youth Worker Conference (CYWC): Fall 2016 and Fall 2017. The next one is scheduled for Nov 2018
- NEXT Children Ministry Conference: April 2017 (Truro) and April(?) 2018 (Moncton). The Next one is schedule for April 2019 (Halifax)
- Ask and Imagine Fall 2016 in Huron

By the time this was written YIG had organized three Diocesan Youth Ministry Conferences (DYMC) in September 2016 (Grand Bay-Westfield), 2017 (Sackville) and 2018 (Rothesay). DYMC 2016 focused on camping ministry, mission, and sports vs. church, with keynote Audrey Cameron. DYMC 2017 focused on youth, family and community, with keynote Geoff MacLean. Each conference was driven by feedback from talking with youth leaders, with our most recent DYMC 2018 being based on results of the Hear Our Youth's Voices surveys.

Youth Training

In May 2016 YIG attempted to hold a youth conference called "Stones Across the Water" at Camp Medley but was cancelled due to low registration. In 2017 YIG began working with the Diocese of Nova Scotia and PEI on DYC (Diocesan Youth Conference). DYC is a long-standing youth conference organized by NS/PEI. YIG thought that instead of reinventing the wheel and creating our own youth conference we would collaborate and co-lead with an established one. Though the conference was successful on NS/PEI's perspective, the Diocese of Fredericton's youth participation was low and we are re-evaluating our partnership with NS/PEI; we are, however, always welcome to attend.

On May 11-12, 2018, more than 50 Anglicans from four parishes joined 2,300 other youth and youth leaders at the first annual ONE conference in Moncton. ONE is an interdenominational youth conference for youth and youth leaders to get together and worship, unite and live under ONE God. The ONE conference was a combination of two previous youth conferences, one from the Baptist Conference called "Springforth" and the Wesleyan Rally in the Valley. Both served youth and youth leaders for decades, with the same youth often attending both. They combined to ONE. This was an amazing experience for both the leaders and youth and another ONE is being organized for next May.

CLAY, Canadian Lutheran Anglican Youth, is another large scale youth conference that takes place bi-annually across Canada. CLAY 2016 took place in Charlottetown, and a team of 7 from two parishes took part. This past August 2018, another two parishes, totalling 8, took part in Thunder Bay, ON with the theme called Threads. YIG agrees that being part of the national Anglican Church is important.

Youth Pilgrimages are also important training for youth and young adult development. YIG Director Colin McDonald discusses this in more detail in his report.

And, of course, the Diocese offers great youth training, development, and leadership with its staple ministries such as Teens Encounter Christ, St. Michael's Conference, Choir School and its camping ministries with Medley and Brookwood.

Opportunities are available for children, youth and young adults to engage with strong Christian activities and events that will help grow their relationship with the Lord and become lifelong Christians.

Inter-Generational

Though YIG does not currently have ongoing events or services besides Family Camp at Camp Medley, YIG is encouraged by various parishes that hold events such as Messy Church, Worship Nights, and also organize oversea mission trips and community dinners. Some parishes are thinking outside the box by incorporating a playground outside their church (Salisbury and Havelock) or in the process of building one inside (the Nerepis and St John), as they continue to engage with their communities and families, while seeking creative ways to be the church in the 21st century.

Many parishes also took part in Alpha and Youth Alpha in the past year. This free program and resource is available for all ages and generations.

Ongoing YIG Projects

Based on the Bishop's Charge in 2017, and CYWC 2017, the YIG team was inspired to create the "Hear Our Youth's Voice" surveys that was released from May-July 2018. By the time this report is written the results would have been released and presented at the DYMC conference in September 2018. Among other topics, these surveys explored existing spiritual practices within families and youth, and also their thoughts on youth ministry. There was also an update from parishes and their opinions on youth ministry.

As evidenced by this report YIG is working hard responding to challenges around youth ministry in the 21st century. We continue to look for creative and innovative ways to engage our youth, and strive to create or provide opportunities for them to learn and grow in their faith, while also potentially developing into leaders. Parishes and ministries within our diocese can be quite diverse, and distinct from one another, and while they are all Anglican it begs the question what exactly is an Anglican identity? YIG is currently working on the motion presented by Diocesan Council, and appreciates your efforts in ministering to our children, youth, and families.

CAMP BROOKWOOD

Camp Brookwood had yet another very successful year. The Camp had 132 campers of a possible 158 campers, with 66 being sponsored (50%). Five of the six weeks were at capacity but 12 sponsored children did not show. If all registered campers arrived the total numbers would have been 144 campers with 78 sponsored.

This year we had a new director. She had previous experience at Camp Brookwood as a camper, CIT, Counsellor, and Assistant Director. There was no returning staff this year but two of the new counsellors were previous campers and CITs. The two male counsellors were new to Camp Brookwood but caught on soon to how the camp operated. In addition, our cook this year had worked at Brookwood 6 years ago and returned to help us out. Chaplains signed up to lead the spiritual side of camp for all 6 weeks. It was a challenge this year running one position short due to the failure to find a student under the SEED program. To help with the extra workload, an individual was hired to mow the lawn, and a student was hired to come in Fridays to help prepare the camp for the following week. This is something that we need to secure funding for to cover the salary for this position if we are not successful with the SEED program in future years.

Operating full camps increases the amount of materials required to operate the camp. A new building was purchased using previous donations at the end of the season for camp supply storage. Things were being stored all over the grounds, in different buildings, wherever space could be found. This will allow things to be stored in one spot.

Major projects funded by the Diocese of Fredericton were the levelling of four camper cabins and four small decks/steps built on the cabins. In addition, a new deck and steps were attached to the craft building. A major leak caused from the aging infrastructure of the underground pool lines also created an opportunity two weeks prior to camp opening. It was necessary to dig new trenches, run new lines and update an aging pool pump. These projects were completed prior to camp with no interruption to the swimming program.

Last year 2017 the expenses to operate the camp was \$57K. If we were unable to secure funding from a variety of individuals, groups, etc. the cost of camp would be approximately \$320 per camper. However, with the support of individuals, parishes, ACW's, grants and fund raising, we were able to continue to offer campers the experience at an affordable price of \$200.

We were again very grateful for the financial support of the Diocese in 2017 through its Youth and Intergenerational Ministry team. We enjoyed another intense week of daily prayer and praise, solid and engaging instruction, and lots of fun. The opportunity for such a range of ages and backgrounds to come together in community is a central part to the success of the conference.

As this report is prepared, we are awaiting our 32nd Conference, which will be held from August 20 to 25. We are looking forward to the addition of some new staff members, even as we will miss several long-time staff whose schedules have not permitted them to be with us this year.

We pray that the Conference continues to model compassionate Christian community for the wider church. Please keep the staff and, above all, the conferees in your prayers during the year that the efforts made during this summer's Conference to grow together in Christ might continue to bear fruit to the glory of God's Name.

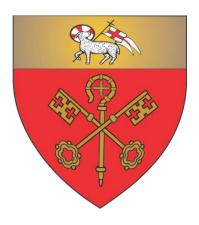

- The missional work of the diocese requires a support structure represented by the Bishop and the work of the Synod Office. Administrative Costs include \$160k for Clergy Support for items such as Clergy Relocation and Clergy Contingency.

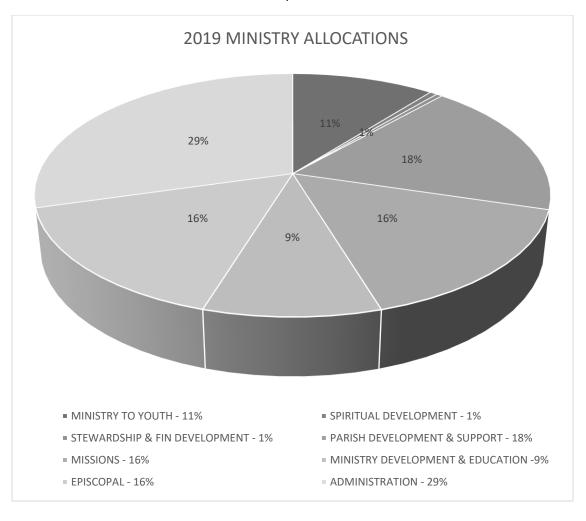

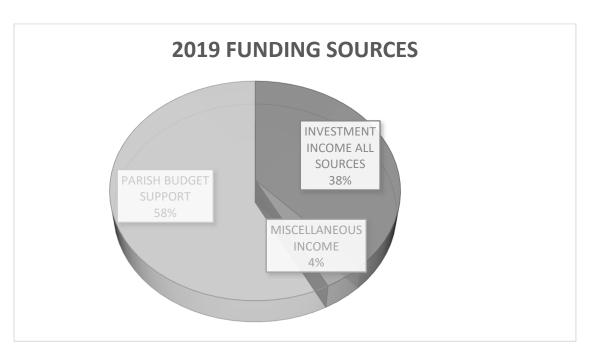

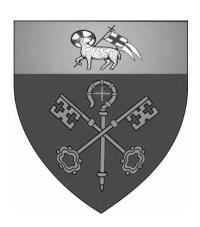

2018 DIOCESAN SHARED MINISTRY BUDGET TO DIOCESAN COUNCIL JANUARY 27, 2018

Diocesan Synod of Fredericton THE DIOCESAN NARRATIVE BUDGET 2018

The shared ministry budget for 2018 was reviewed and is recommended for approval by the Diocesan Finance Committee.

The focus of this narrative budget is on the mission and ministry of the Diocese. The Narrative Budget is accompanied by the numerical budget that has been traditionally presented, so that the individual line items are available to members of Council. The Finance Committee has reviewed the individual line items.

To begin the conversion of the numerical budget to the narrative budget, we look first at the diocesan mission statement:

"To Proclaim the Gospel of Jesus Christ for the Making of New Disciples"

We also need to look at the budget in the context of the 2015 bishop's charge which was reinforced in 2016 and 2017:

- begin with Jesus, talk about Jesus, be Jesus in our communities
- pray and learn about prayer
- learn the bible and the scriptures upon which our faith is founded
- train our leaders
- build up our youth
- engage our communities
- go forward with God

And finally, as with all Diocesan initiatives, we need to incorporate the Five Marks of Mission in our delivery:

- Proclaim the Good News of the Kingdom
- Teach, Baptise and Nurture New Believers
- Respond to Human Need by Loving Service
- Transform Unjust Structures of Society, Challenge Violence of Every Kind and Pursue Peace and Reconciliation
- Strive to Safeguard the Integrity of Creation, and Sustain and Renew the Life of the Earth

In the preparation and presentation of the 2018 Draft Shared Ministry Budget, we have focussed on the major areas of ministry undertaken by the Diocese:

- 1. Ministries with Youth
- 2. Spiritual Development
- 3. Stewardship
- 4. Parish Development and Support
- 5. Mission and Ministry
- 6. Ministry Development and Education

All the resources of the diocese are focused on these six key ministry areas. As the missional work of the diocese requires a support structure represented by the Bishop and the work of the Synod Office, the proportional administrative, governance or episcopal components of the 2018 budget have been allocated to each of these ministries.

1. MINISTRIES WITH YOUTH

Train a child in the way he should go, and when he is old he will not turn from it. Proverbs 22:6

Our commitment to youth throughout the diocese is vital to the life of our church and the activities that we undertake to build up our youth take a variety of forms:

- Our Diocesan camps: Medley and Brookwood, where children are given an experience that will carry them throughout their lives and a faith foundation through knowing that they are loved by Jesus;
- Diocesan interaction with the development of young people seeking to know the love of God and practice their spirituality: St. Michael's Conference, Teens Encounter Christ, Bishop's Court Discipleship House;
- Reaching out to those who young people who have seek comfort through the ministry of the Saint John Inner City Youth Ministry and Safe Harbour House;
- The development of our future leaders through a Youth Chaplaincy focus, and Youth and Youth leadership training events.

Overall, our commitment to this area of Ministry represents \$251,180 or 8.6% of the overall budget, without the inclusion of grants and contributions distributed in support of this ministry.

While the bulk of the funding for this budget area falls under the operating funds provided through the Shared Ministry Budget, there is some financial support available from the St. Paul's Valley Trust for Medley and Saint John Inner City support as they relate to youth.

2. SPIRITUAL DEVELOPMENT

But grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. To him be the glory both now and forever! Amen. 2 Peter 3:18

In the words of the Bishop in his 2016 Charge, "Learning about prayer is discovering what it is to be able to live in the presence of God." Through our commitment to Spiritual Development, we focus on helping clergy, laity and parishes to know how to pray, how to make Jesus central in their lives, and how to minister and evangelize to bring people to faith in Jesus on several fronts.

Some of the key activities that have taken place through the engagement of Spiritual Development in the Diocese are as follows:

- "See through the Scriptures" sessions led by the Bishop;
- Annual Lenten Studies engaging people in congregations throughout the diocese in simultaneous prayer and spiritual development;
- Bishop's Pilgrimage walks in the Archdeaconries, giving people opportunities to share in prayer and demonstrate their love of Jesus;
- Promoting opportunities for people to be seen in their communities as people of faith, stepping out of their comfort zones to take Jesus to the people where they live and work and play;
- Continued Layreader and Laity development to increase spiritual leadership;
- Support for prayer and praise through the Diocesan Choir School.

Overall, our commitment to this area of Ministry represents \$152,421 or 5.2% of the overall budget, without the inclusion of grants and contributions distributed in support of this ministry. With grants and contributions included, the total commitment is \$158,921 or 5.4% of budget.

3. STEWARDSHIP DEVELOPMENT

Each one should use whatever gift he has received to serve others, faithfully administering God's grace it its various forms. 1 Peter 4:10

Our commitment to Stewardship recognizes that there are different gifts given, and we each have the ability to use those gifts to serve others, be it with time, talent or treasures – to indeed faithfully administer God's grace.

- For the past several years, a different aspect of stewardship has been presented at the annual Stewardship Conference. In 2017 the theme for the conference was "Sharing in Mission" with a connection made between promoting stewardship of time, talents and treasures and using these gifts to go out into our communities in mission. The evaluation of this event was very positive, and people asked for more opportunities to learn about what others are doing. It is anticipated that the 2018 focus will be on showing how good stewardship and spiritual development work in concert and are intertwined in practice.
- Additional focus on stewardship in promoted through the work of the Stewardship
 Officer, the availability of annual Stewardship Sunday worship aids and the ongoing
 encouragement of parishes to engage in Back to Church Sunday where the act of
 invitation is key to reaching out to others in the name of Christ.

Creation Matters, both at the diocesan level and as part of the national program teaches
us to think and act on the Fifth Mark of Mission: "Strive to Safeguard the Integrity of
Creation, and Sustain and Renew the Life of the Earth" This budget includes a Green pilot
project to promote that sustainability of our resources.

Overall, our commitment to this area of Ministry represents \$60,935 or 2.5% of the overall budget, and there are no grants and contributions distributed in support of this ministry.

4. PARISH DEVELOPMENT AND SUPPORT

Just as each of us has one body with many members, and these members do not all have the same function, so in Christ we who are many form one body, and each member belongs to all the others. Romans 12: 4-5

Our commitment to engaging communities for the cure of souls is demonstrated through the Diocesan parish development and support programs – stronger parishes will make for a stronger Diocese. This support takes many forms:

- The Ministry Development Fund, established in 2015 to provide support to parishes with innovative approaches to ministry and allow them to take on development projects, has been well accessed. In 2017, projects were approved for implementation or continuation in 2018 to the value of \$96,795 which is significant in supporting parishes to undertake programs or activities which would not otherwise have been achievable;
- A full-time Diocesan Parish Development Officer in 2018, funded in part through the
 Dorothy Roberta Wilkes General Fund. The role of this position will be on helping
 parishes to overcome obstacles, or perceived obstacles, that are stumbling blocks to their
 mission plan;
- Weekly E-News features and monthly publication of the NB Anglican to help parishes keep connected and aware about what is happening in the diocese and beyond. The work of the Diocesan Communications Officer to encourage parish input and promote the development of parish communications officers is ongoing and shows promise;
- Responding to human need by providing loving service to parishioners in hospital as well
 as their families through Hospital Chaplaincies in Fredericton, Saint John and Moncton
 which are the major medical centres for people from individual parishes seeking medical
 attention;
- Resources made available to parishes and/or individuals through the Diocesan Resource Centre;
- Diocesan wide support for Clergy relocation, payroll and benefit administration, investment management and insurance administration are just a few of the support services that are facilitated by the synod office on behalf of individual parishes;

 On a national scale, through our connection to the Anglican Church of Canada, support to parishes is provided through National Resources for Mission and Anglican Foundation membership.

Overall, our commitment to this area of Ministry represents \$1,186,620 or 40.7% of the overall budget, without the inclusion of grants and contributions distributed in support of this ministry. With grants and contributions included, the total commitment is \$1,318,415 or 45.2% of budget.

5. MINISTRY AND MISSION

Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age. Matthew 28: 19-20

Our diocese has been blessed with the commitment of individuals who reach out beyond the Church doors and find their focus on ministry with the people most in need – those who are disadvantaged, are newcomers or people in need in our country and those in other countries. As well, our budget facilitates us in reaching out to others at home and around the world, knowing their needs and doing what we can in loving service to ease their burdens. Some of these ministries are:

- The Central Saint John Community Ministry by the Rev's Jasmine and Terence Chandra;
- West Side Anglican Mission led by the Rev. Rob Salloum;
- Our Companion Diocese of Ho in Ghana;
- Uganda Mission work at the Bishop McAllister College by Canon Paul Jeffries;
- The Honduras Mission in Roatan with Kara and Nelson Mejia;
- International ministry through PWRDF and initiatives of the Anglican Church of Canada such as Global Relations, Council of the North, Anglican Military Ordinate, the Anglican Healing Fund, and Indigenous Ministry;
- Diocesan mission grants to various areas of ministry in our diocese.

Overall, our commitment to this area of Ministry represents \$270,694 or 9.3% of the overall budget, without the inclusion of grants and contributions distributed in support of this ministry. With grants and contributions included, the total commitment is \$607,918 or 20.8% of budget.

While our support for national ministry is funded mostly by the diocesan Shared Ministry Budget and through diocesan trust and fund mission support, much of the funding is provided by individuals and parishes throughout the diocese and in some cases, beyond the diocesan boundaries. Our commitment to the Central Saint John Community Ministry is made possible by the Dorothy Roberta Wilkes General Fund.

6. MINISTRY DEVELOPMENT AND EDUCATION

The gifts He gave were that some would be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, some pastors and teachers, to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ, until all of us come to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to maturity, to the measure of the full stature of Christ. Ephesians 4: 11-13

Our commitment to developing our leaders, both clergy and laity, and to facilitating the work of ministry begins with the discernment process and continues to those already ordained and working in parish ministry through support for the discernment process and for laity development. Our commitment is achieved through the following activities:

- Establishment of two Territorial Archdeacon positions to support and enhance the work of the bishop and provide greater focus on developing trends and concerns;
- Opportunities for episcopal teaching events;
- Training of future clergy by supporting theological education;
- Individual divinity bursaries;
- Opportunities for summer divinity student placement in a ministry internship environment;
- Mentoring of new clergy through a curacy program and post ordination training;
- Clergy opportunities for ongoing educational opportunities such as clergy days, the annual clergy college and clergy conference, and more intensive leadership development through the 12-12-12 program;
- Further support where possible to encourage the advancement of ministry in parishes through the placement and financial support of clergy in innovative or shared ministry situations.

Overall, our commitment to this area of Ministry represents \$350,033 or 12% of the overall budget, without the inclusion of grants and contributions distributed in support of this ministry. With grants and contributions included, the total commitment is \$373,533 or 12.8% of budget.

GRANTS AND CONTRIBUTIONS

Each of the ministry areas of the 2018 Diocesan Shared Ministry has associated grants and/or contributions that are provided as part of the mission focus. Taken as a separate item, Grants and Contributions total **\$636,169** and represent **21.8%** of the 2018 budget. Following is a breakdown of those financial commitments to ministry.

SUMMARY:

Overall, the 2018 Diocesan Shared Ministry Budget is focused on the six key areas of diocesan mission and ministry. Total expenditures for the year are projected at \$ 2,918,852 as follows:

Stewardship	\$ 71,935	2.5%
Parish Development	\$1,318,415	45.2%
Mission and Ministry	\$ 607,918	20.8%

Total Expenditures	\$ 2,918,852	100.0%

Of these expenditures, \$788,942 will be provided by specific funds or transfers from reserves, and \$378,170 will be based on cost recoveries, leaving \$1,469,278 to be funded through the operating budget.

It is of significant note that the funds provided by the two bequests left to the Diocese by Miss Dorothy Roberta Wilkes have generated income that will be directed to providing ministry support and educational opportunities which would not otherwise be achievable. Her legacy is being used to build a stronger diocese and will continue to do so in the future as the capital will remain intact.

Other funding sources include investment income, contributions from the parishes for support of the shared ministry budget, benefit premium recovery from non-parish employees, and miscellaneous income generated by fees, appeals, and other sundry income sources. Total **Income projected is \$2,638,890**, leaving a **budget deficit of \$279,962**.

It is expected that this projected deficit will be managed through a combination of reduced program costs or increased revenues. Funds remaining after the completion of programs or activities that do not utilize their full budget allocation will be directed towards reducing the deficit.

1. Nature of operations

The Diocesan Synod of Fredericton represents the administrative and episcopal head of the Anglican Church of Canada operations in New Brunswick. The corporation is a charitable organization within the meaning of the Income Tax Act (Canada) and as such, is exempt from income taxes.

2. Summary of significant accounting policies

(a) Basis of presentation

The Diocese's financial statements are prepared in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations.

(b) Fund accounting

The Diocese has adopted Fund accounting to classify and report certain aspects of its operations. The specific funds established by the Diocese are as follows:

Internally restricted funds

Provisions for special purposes

Special purpose funds refer to funds received or allocated from budget for future use or distribution in support of specific endeavours. These funds generally do not accrue any interest benefit and there is no external restriction as to use of capital.

Designated funds

Designated funds are held by the Diocese and are generally limited to use of earnings only. Earnings are distributed or remitted in a manner consistent with historical or specific terms of reference for each fund.

Investment retained reserve

The Investment retained reserve represents an internal equity position within the investment portfolio which is not available to benefit general operations.

Capital asset fund

The capital asset fund reports the assets, liabilities, revenue and expenses related to capital assets.

Externally restricted funds

Diocesan trusts

Diocesan Trusts have been established through estate bequests and are generally limited to use of earnings only. Earnings are distributed or remitted as per the terms of each individual trust agreement.

2. Summary of significant accounting policies (continued)

Diocesan funds

Diocesan funds have been established through unrestricted bequests and other means, and may not be limited to use of earnings only. Earnings are distributed or remitted as per the terms of each individual fund.

Parochial investments

Parochial investments have been established through funding from individual parishes and their use is restricted as specified by those parishes.

(c) Depreciation

Capital assets are recorded at cost and amortized over the useful lives of the assets. The annual rates to amortize assets are as follows:

Buildings 40 years straight line Office furniture and equipment 5 years straight line

(d) Collections - antiques

The Diocese maintains a collection of antique furniture with an insured value of \$58,885. The collection is not capitalized. There were no maintenance expenses with respect to the collection in the current year.

(e) Investments

Investments are recorded at fair value using quoted market prices with changes in fair value recognized as unrealized gains or losses in the calculation of excess of revenues over expenditures for the Investment fund retained reserve. Transaction costs related to the purchase of investments are charged immediately to excess of revenues over expenditures.

(f) Investment earnings

Interest credited to designated funds, provision for special purposes, diocesan funds and parochial investments, is calculated on the balance of capital using a rate of 3.50% (2016 - 3.50%). Interest credited to the Diocesan trusts is calculated on the balance of capital using a rate of 6.73% (2016 - 9.27%).

Gains and losses realized or unrealized on investment dispositions are credited or charged to the operating fund in the year of disposition. Periodically, a bonus is credited to other funds and trusts on account of net gains realized. In 2017, a 1.50% bonus of the balance of capital was credited (2016 –1.50%).

(g) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include balances in bank accounts, income related cash balances in investment accounts and guaranteed investment certificates with maturities of one year or less.

2. Summary of significant accounting policies (continued)

(h) Contributed services

Volunteers contribute numerous hours per year to assist the Diocese in carrying out its activities. Due to the difficulty of determining their fair value, contributed services are not recognized in the financial statements.

(i) Revenue recognition

Contributions and other revenue amounts are recognized as revenue if information or estimates are available and collection is reasonably assured. No revenue is recognized for amounts pledged but not received. Investment income is recognized on an accrual basis, as it is earned.

(j) Expense recognition

Expenses are recognized on an accrual basis as costs are incurred. Administration and general expenditures are not subject to reallocation procedures to projects and activities.

(k) Post retirement benefits

The employees of the Diocese participate in a defined benefit pension plan administered nationally by the Anglican Church of Canada as referred to in note 8.

(I) Use of estimates

In preparing the Diocese's financial statements, management is required to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, the disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and reported amounts of revenue and expenses during the period. Significant areas requiring the use of estimates relate to depreciation rates, estimated useful lives of capital assets and the amount of allowance determined for potential non-collection of receivables. Actual results could differ from these estimates.

(m) Financial instruments

The Diocese considers any contract creating a financial asset, liability or equity instrument as a financial instrument, except in certain limited circumstances. The Diocese accounts for the following as financial instruments:

- Cash and cash equivalents
- Investments
- Receivables and advances
- Payables and accruals
- Term loan

A financial assets or liability is recognized when the Diocese becomes party to contractual provisions of the instrument.

2. Summary of significant accounting policies (continued)

Measurement

The Diocese initially measures its financial assets and financial liabilities at fair value.

Financial assets or liabilities obtained in related party transactions are measured in accordance with the accounting policy for related party transactions except for those transactions that are with a person or entity whose sole relationship with the Diocese is in the capacity of management in which case they are accounted for in accordance with accounting policies for financial instruments.

The Diocese subsequently measures all of its financial assets and financial liabilities at cost or amortized cost less any reduction for impairment, except for investments in equity instruments that are quoted in an active market, which are measured at fair value, and certain financial assets and financial liabilities which the Diocese has elected to measure at fair value. Changes in fair value are recognized in excess of revenue over expenditure.

7. Contingencies

The Diocese has guaranteed loans to parishes from the Anglican Foundation totalling \$184,697 at December 31, 2017.

The Diocese has guaranteed inter parish loans totalling \$1,010,919 at December 31, 2017.

The Diocese has also guaranteed the debt of the parish of The Nerepis & Saint John to the Bank of Nova Scotia to a maximum of \$96,935.

8. Employee future benefits

The Diocese and its employees participate in a multi-employer contributory defined benefit pension plan (the General Synod Pension Plan of the Anglican Church of Canada). The Diocese also participates in the national Employers Group Benefits Plan (Retirees) which is a benefits plan for retired clergy.

Since sufficient information is not readily available to account for the Diocese's participation in either plan using defined benefit plan accounting, these financial statements have been prepared using accounting rules for defined contribution plans.

The current year pension plan expense for Diocese office and administrative staff was \$87,233 (2016 - \$81,983). The current year pension plan remittance for all Diocese staff and parish personnel including clergy was \$570,073 (2016 - \$580,833). The current year expense for the retired clergy benefits plan under the administration of the national office was \$112,822 (2016 - \$89,346).

9. Budget

The 2017 budget figures are presented for comparison with the actual figures; they have not been subject to review engagement procedures.

10. Related parties

Camp Medley is a Christian youth program offered in New Brunswick that provides residential camping and Christian youth leadership development. The corporation is a charitable organization within the meaning of the Income Tax Act (Canada) and as such, is exempt from tax.

The Diocese appoints all members of the board of directors of Camp Medley. In this capacity, under the definitions of Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations, the Diocese controls this organization and therefore further information on Camp Medley's operations is required to be presented in these financial statements.

Camp Medley has not been consolidated in the Diocese's financial statements. An unaudited financial summary of Camp Medley at December 31, 2017 is as follows:

13. Financial instruments

The Diocese is exposed to various risks through its financial instruments. The following analysis provides a measure of the Diocese's risk exposures and concentrations at December 31, 2017.

Credit risk

Credit risk is the risk that one party to a financial instrument will cause a financial loss for the other party by failing to discharge an obligation. The Diocese's main credit risks relate to its accounts receivable and guarantees. The entity provides credit to its parishes in the normal course of its operations. There was no significant change in exposure from the prior year.

Liquidity risk

Liquidity risk is the risk that the Diocese will encounter difficulty in meeting the obligations associated with its financial liabilities. The Diocese is exposed to this risk mainly in respect of its interfund loan, term loan, employee savings plan, and accounts payable. There was no significant change in exposure from the prior year.

Market risk

Market risk is the risk that the fair value or expected future cash flows of a financial instrument will fluctuate because of changes in market prices. Market risk comprises three types of risk: currency risk, interest rate risk and other price risk. The Diocese is mainly exposed to currency risk and interest rate risk

Market risk(continued)

(i) Currency risk

Currency risk is the risk that the fair value or future cash flows of a financial instrument will fluctuate because of changes in foreign exchange rates. Consequently, some assets are exposed to foreign exchange fluctuations. There was no significant change in exposure from the prior year.

(ii) Interest rate risk

Interest rate risk is the risk that the fair value or future cash flows of a financial instrument will fluctuate because of changes in market interest rates. The Diocese is exposed to interest rate risk on its fixed rate financial instruments. Given the current composition of long-term debt, fixed-rate instruments subject the Diocese to a fair value risk. There was no significant change in exposure from the prior year.

(iii) Other price risk

Other price risk is the risk that the fair value or future cash flows of a financial instrument will fluctuate because of changes in market prices (other than those arising from interest rate risk or currency risk), whether those changes are caused by factors specific to the individual financial instrument or its issuer, or factors affecting all similar financial instruments traded in the market. The Diocese is exposed to other price risk through its investments quoted in an active market.

It is management's opinion that the Diocese is not subject to significant amounts of concentration risk as the risk is managed by diversifying its portfolio among asset classes, industry sectors, individual securities and geographical locations.

There was no significant change in exposure from the prior year.

14. Leased properties

Certain lands and buildings that were part of the original school property have been leased to the Rothesay Collegiate School at a nominal rental of \$1 per year to December 31, 2100.

In 2016, the Diocese entered into an agreement with Partners for Youth Inc. to operate a facility for homeless youth. The property is leased to Partners for Youth Inc. at a nominal rental of \$1 per year.

15. Capital management

Management considers capital to be the Diocese's fund balances. The Diocese's objective when managing capital is to maintain financial strength to sustain long term delivery of its core services.

To assist in managing investment capital the Diocese employs a capital management plan, in the form of an Investment Policy Statement ("IPS"), that is reviewed annually by the Finance Committee. The IPS, which establishes policies for management of its investments, dictates the Diocese's approach to growth, credit quality and profitability objectives. The overall objectives in investing the assets of the Diocese are to preserve and enhance the value of capital through adequate diversification in high quality investments and achieve the highest investment return that can be obtained within the level of risk acceptable to the Finance Committee. The following description of the IPS is a summary only. For more information, reference should be made to the IPS document.

Subject to limitations, the IPS investment guidelines outline that the investment fund may invest in any or all of the following asset categories: equities and fixed income. The proportion of investment in each asset class is subject to restrictions including maintaining the following asset mix; 40% - 60% investment in equities and 40% - 60% investment in Fixed Income.

There has been no change in the overall strategy employed during the year ended December 31, 2017.

Dear Bishop Edwards:

Thank you for your correspondence, sent on behalf of the Synod of the Anglican Diocese of Fredericton, concerning Bill C-51, An Act to amend the Criminal Code and the Department of Justice Act and to make consequential amendments to another Act. I regret the delay in responding.

I agree that Canadians of all religions must be able to practice their faith in a safe and respectful environment. Please be assured that, as Minister of Justice and Attorney General of Canada, I am committed to ensuring that the rights and freedoms enshrined in the *Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms*, including the freedom to practice one's religion, are protected for all Canadians.

As you know, Bill C-51 in its original form proposed to repeal section 176 of the *Criminal Code*, which prohibits, among other things, disturbing a religious service. The intent was to modernize the *Criminal Code* and to repeal offences that are duplicative of more general offences. I would like to emphasize that Bill C-51 was never meant to weaken the fundamental freedom to practice one's religion.

The conduct that is prohibited by section 176 includes obstructing or preventing a clergyman or minister from celebrating a service or performing any other function related to his calling; assaulting a clergyman or minister or offering any violence to him; and disturbing or interrupting religious worship. This type of conduct can be addressed by other offences in the *Criminal Code*. For example, it is already an offence to cause a disturbance, assault someone, and utter threats. It is also an offence to incite hatred against identifiable groups, including those distinguished by religion. Moreover, the *Criminal Code* prohibits the intentional interference or obstruction of the lawful use or enjoyment of property, as well as destruction of property, with aggravated penalties in cases where religious property is damaged or destroyed, or where enjoyment of religious property is interrupted. Finally, it is an aggravating factor for sentencing purposes when an offence is motivated by bias, prejudice, or hate based on religion.



Nevertheless, during the study of Bill C-51 by the House of Commons Standing Committee on Justice and Human Rights, committee members and the Government listened to concerns from witnesses and constituents about the repeal of section 176. An amendment was put forward to retain and modernize this section to ensure that it is

gender neutral and to clarify that it applies to all religious and spiritual services. The Government of Canada supports the amendment. Canadians must be able to practice their faith or spirituality without fear of violence or disturbance.
