Overview

The Book of Common Prayer (BCP) is so much more than a liturgical resource book. This course endeavours to provide introductory perspectives relating to the history, structure and collects as well as provide a brief overview of the daily office. It is the intent that this course will provide a foundation for discussion between the layreader and incumbent and is not intended as an in depth study of the BCP.

- 1. Provide an outline of how the BCP is used as both a resource and in public prayer.
- 2. Describe how the liturgy of the BCP teaches us to hear and understand Scripture.
- 3. Provide a basic understanding of the history of the BCP.
- 4. Introduce the importance of the collects & leading worship.
